
SYNOD REVIVAL

LSI Foster Care and Adoption is proud to be part of the Native Families for Native Children (NF4NC) project, which is a collaborative effort between the four native tribes of Nebraska, human services agencies and private agency partners in Nebraska and Iowa. As part of the project's efforts, we recruit, train, license and support Native American families in accord with the traditions, needs and resources of their communities.

Rebecca and Kirby expanded their family when they adopted their son in January. The couple had the opportunity to work with the Omaha Tribe and were able to participate in the second Customary Adoption in the State of Iowa.

Through their Customary Adoption, the family completed a culture plan with the tribe and will be able to keep their newly adopted son connected to his cultural roots with the Omaha Tribe. The new family also was able to keep their son connected to his biological siblings, so he can continue to be involved with them.

Dear Friends in Christ,

Yesterday (April 21st) I had homebound visits to do on both sides of the river--one in Montrose, one in Nauvoo. I like to do it that way so that I can have a good reason to go down through Keokuk, and up that magnificent stretch of the Great River Road between Hamilton and Nauvoo. I also planned to participate in a Zoom meeting with bishop's assistant Pr. Dan Kuckuck and other "interim" pastors; for this meeting, and for the first time, I planned to participate by phone. After my Montrose visit, I went down to Keokuk, listening to the beginning of the meeting on my phone as I stopped briefly at Casey's. It began to rain, and rain pretty hard-hard enough that I could barely hear the other people at the meeting. I also got a SPAM call, the ringtone for which (my phone's ringtone is pretty obnoxious--note to self: I really should *change* that one of these days) was heard by all the other participants. So, I drove to the riverfront--that was my original plan, to park the car and enjoy the ambience while I listened and spoke. Unfortunately, it started raining much harder, so loudly that I couldn't hear *anything* over the phone. So, I ran out of the car through the downpour to a shelter; once I was inside, it started raining harder yet--the rain on that metal roof increased the decibel level even more. The tornado warning siren also went off. The rain slackened somewhat, but when that happened a BNSF coal train *very loudly* announced *its* presence about 150 feet behind me, and took a few minutes to *very loudly* go by.

Through it all I managed to hear the big majority of what my colleagues had to say, but I don't think I'm going to try to do that "phone thing" again any time soon.

One thing I *did* hear was something I think worthy of passing on to you. One of the pastors has been telling her congregation that they need to think of themselves--their church, that is--as a "dinosaur". A dinosaur which is in the process of evolving into something else. You've probably heard somewhere along the line that birds are the closest evolutionary descendants of the dinosaurs; this pastor has been teaching her people that the church of the future will be as different as a *bird* is from a *dinosaur*, though it will possess the same DNA. (I asked her jokingly if that's copyrighted, and she said no--"that's just my stuff", to which I said that I'll find a use for it myself one of these days.)



We all know by now that a lot of things are different from what they used to be, and that they're going to *continue* to be different. We're in the process of evolving, and as long as we don't try to alter or get rid of our "DNA" (reliance on God and God's Word), we'll be fine. Jesus said so, and that's good enough for *any* of us!
