FROM YOUR CALL COMMITTEE

The Call Committee, consisting of Tom Bonar, Todd Chelf, Mike Hopp, Pam Taylor, Rachel Lindeen, and Kim Engle, has begun work on the intensive process to welcome a new pastor. We are meeting weekly and are currently focused on the initial task of completing our Ministry Site Profile.

The MSP is an introduction to the life and work of Bethany. While not an exhaustive description of every aspect of our ministry, it should provide enough information to pique the interest of prospective candidates for call. It's a very important document that provides us an opportunity to examine who we are and what we're all about. It requires that we think prayerfully, creatively, and honestly to identify and express what we need from, and what we can offer to a new pastor. For example:

- What plans does God have for us to even more fully worship and glorify Him?
- What ministry activities bring out the best in us and seem to be valued by others?
- If Bethany didn't exist, what holes would be present in our community? What needs would go unmet?
- What gifts has God granted us to enable us to meet those needs?
- What can our congregation offer to a prospective pastor to enhance his or her own spiritual growth?

To do this right, we need the participation of the entire congregation—those who worship regularly each Sunday, those who attend the Hope Service, those who participate through our online service, and those members who may not be able to attend regularly, but are still a valued part of our Bethany family.

In the weeks ahead, you will be asked to participate in various ways—surveys, questionnaires, and other activities to help us identify our identity/purpose, gifts/resources, and context/needs. It is our intent to provide regular updates about our progress and to be as open as possible. Please keep in mind, however, that a large part of the call process must be confidential. We will not be able to share any kind of identifying information about individual candidates because we cannot violate the privacy of any candidate who, for example, is exploring a new call, but has not yet shared this information with his/her current congregation. So, while it's absolutely fine for you to ask questions of a member of the Call Committee about where we are in the process and how things are going, please be understanding if we are unable to answer some specific inquiries.

While being between pastors is a stressful time for any congregation, and it can feel like we're drifting without a rudder, trust that we are not. God is leading us to great things for His honor and glory. This can actually be a very exciting time full of great possibilities. Let us continue to work and worship as we go forward with service to those around us and to each other, as usual, in faith and peace and love.

A Picture of Foster Care and Adoption

The goal of foster care is to reunite children with the parents when possible. The foster family can play an integral part in making that happen, often becoming mentors to the birth parents, helping them learn parenting skills they may not have had modeled to them.

An LSI provider told me about a picture she had recently received. Imagine, if you would, a photo of two women, one on each end of a bench, and four kids with them. All happy. All smiling. It looks like they were enjoying a beautiful day in the park.

On the left is the birth mother of those kids. She will be the first to admit, things haven't been easy – but she loves these kids.

The other woman is the foster mother. She loves these kids too. Two of the kids were adopted by the foster family, one lives with the birth mom, and the foster child on the mother's lap was soon to be reunited with the birth mom. They are celebrating Mother's Day together.

Foster families provide more than a safe place for children to land. This foster/adoptive parent is a wonderful mentor for this birth mom!



Dear Friends in Christ,

By now our two churches have begun a partnership which, purely by chance, happens to be starting around the time of a very, very important national mid-term election. In anticipation of this, I went back into church files to find the article I wrote to the churches in Fort Madison and Nauvoo for the October, 2016 newsletter. Let's just say that when I got it out and read what I wrote back then, I wasn't the least bit surprised to see that it speaks to the present moment in time every bit as well. So, in the interest of "full disclosure" of what you can expect from me with regard to things that might be considered "controversial", here's that article, verbatim:

I was recently in the company of a group of my fellow clergy — most of them Lutheran, but there were representatives of the UCC and the Episcopalians as well. We were about the business of studying and discussing the biblical texts that were assigned for that week's upcoming Sunday. We all recognized the political overtones present in the readings (there usually *are* some), and one of our number made the statement that in today's poisonous political and social climate, he often feels that he "can't breathe" when it comes to preaching and teaching — that he can't say anything these days without someone being angered by what they hear as a "politically partisan" remark. Instantly there were nods and verbal assent by many others in the room. My short contribution to that discussion I know share with you: "Nonetheless, we can't let this atmosphere keep us (pastors) from doing our jobs."

Our Lord Jesus lived in times as politically charged as the ones we have been experiencing in recent years. There were those who wanted Him to join their cause, fomenting violent revolution in the process, and bring back the good old days when David reigned, when a united Israel was the "biggest, toughest kid on the block"; there were those who wanted Him to embrace their more separatist, more monastic form of religion (in other words, stick to the "spiritual", and have nothing to do with the outside world); and then there were those representing the religious institution of the day who wanted to have Him under their control. And somehow, Jesus managed to infuriate and/or disappoint the vast majority of them! He insisted on telling people about something that didn't fit into any of these groups' agendas – something He called "The Kingdom of God". I promise you that God and His Kingdom will always be the focus of my preaching and teaching. Will it sometimes have secular political overtones? Yes, it will; that's unavoidable. Will it sometimes rub against some of your own political views? Possibly. This world will one day become "The Kingdom of our Lord, and of His Christ" (Revelation 11:15), and the sooner the better!

But until then, the presence of God's Kingdom will rub shoulders with all of the world's power structures, and we will have to make individual decisions based on which of those structures most embody the ideals of God's Kingdom. It's a messy and stressful situation, to say the least. That said, we'll do ourselves – and our country – a big favor by committing ourselves to being, first and foremost, ambassadors and embassies of that coming Kingdom. I will continue to make it my top priority to help our churches be exactly that.
