Your friendliness, grace, compassion, thoughtfulness, reverence, and love have consistently touched my soul during every moment of our time together. I will forever cherish every sacred moment we shared in our partnership in God's Kingdom.

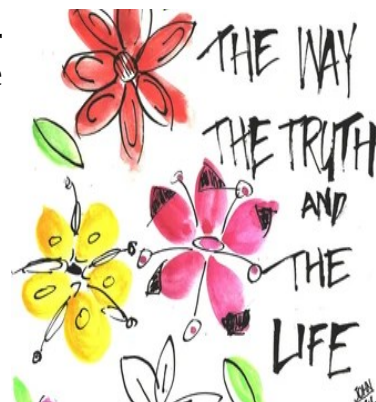
