#### HELP WANTED!!!

We are currently without a custodian. Presently, custodial tasks are being done by volunteers. Many thanks go out to Adella and Alivia Logan for cleaning the Sanctuary, Roxanna Simas and Betty Gaughan for cleaning the kitchen, and Dennis Buckley for various other areas. Trustees and SPRC are considering several options.

### † Pastor's Letter †

#### Dear Friends in Ministry

Please pray for our denomination, United Methodist Church as we are approaching the Special Session of General Conference on February 23 (Saturday) – 26 (Tuesday), 2019 in St. Louise, Missouri. Our denomination was almost split into two in the previous General Conference (2016) when the conflict got so heated and a motion for division was on the table over the issue of full inclusion of LGBTQ brothers and sisters into the life of the church. At that time, Rev. Adam Hamilton and Rev. Mike Slaughter appealed the Council of Bishops to hold the motion and to lead the church toward a way forward without splitting. Then the Council of Bishops suggested creating a Commission on a Way Forward. This "32-member Commission was authorized by General Conference 2016 and appointed by the Council of Bishops to examine paragraphs in the Book of Discipline concerning human sexuality and exploring options to strengthen the unity of the church" (http://www.umc.org/topics/general-conference-2019-special-session).

Day to day schedule at Special Session will be as follows:

#### Day 1 | Sunday, Feb. 24

- Worship
- Presentation from the Commission on Way Forward
- In plenary discussion it will seek to discern which of the multiple plans the majority of delegates want to refine.

#### Day 2 | Monday, Feb. 25

• In a legislative committee of the whole all petitions will be amended and voted on petitions.

#### Day 3 | Tuesday, Feb. 26

• The delegates will return to plenary for final voting and consider what their actions mean for the future.

Let us pray for our denomination! Bishops appealed us to pray, saying "Since General Conference 2016, our church has experienced conflict as we navigate rough waters. How can we show God's great love and mercy to one another as we make decisions? (Please read Council of Bishops' letter sent to all LGBTQ believers included in this D's & O's) As we move closer to the special-called session of General Conference, we invite all UMC members, across the denomination to pray and ask for God's guidance.... Our prayer focus is two-fold: We are praying that (1) **God will help us to fulfill the mission of the church**, and we are praying (2) **to be one in Christ.**" Our Bishop Minerva G. Carcaño asks us to pray each day at 2:23 pm to 2:26 for 3 minutes, signifying dates for Special Session 2/23 - 2/26. Will you join me in this prayer movement? If there is ever a place where we can be one, it's in the space where we meet God. May God help us all!

Rejoice in all circumstances, pray without ceasing, and give thanks always!

To our Global LGBTQ Kin in Christ,

The Council of Bishops of The United Methodist Church recognizes the ways in which the convening of the Special Session of General Conference creates a time and space of harm for you and members of your family. To be the focus of attention, discussion and debate is hurtful.

Demeaning and dehumanizing comments and attacks on LGBTQ persons in conversations related to the upcoming February Conference are a great tragedy and do violence to hearts, minds, and spirits. When you suffer, the whole body of Christ suffers. Together, we need to work to resist hate, violence, and oppression of persons. In these attitudes and actions, great harm is done throughout the community, to the offended and the offender.

As Paul wrote in 1 Corinthians 12: We cannot say to a part of the body, "I have no need of you." We belong to each other. In our Baptism, we are incorporated into the Church, the body of Christ, and made one in Christ. The Church pledges to every baptized member: "Your joy, your pain, your gain, your loss, are ours, for you are one of us." (*The UMC Book of Worship*, pg. 83). Our Book of Discipline clearly states that all people are of sacred worth.

As leaders of the church, we are brokenhearted by conversations that dishonor, objectify and dehumanize. We confess, as Bishops of The United Methodist Church and as we attempt to honor our convictions, that our actions and words have not always been life-giving or honoring of the LGBTQ community. Amid our sorrow, we seek to learn and grow in grace. To that end, we commit ourselves to helping people who disagree with each other to have conversations that include, honor, and respect people with different convictions. We are a diverse group of leaders—conservative, centrist, progressive—however, we are unified in our commitment to work together in ways that will give you and all God's children strength, comfort and hope for better and more merciful tomorrows.

As the Special Session of General Conference approaches, we pray that the Holy Spirit will draw us together. May we see the image of God in one another, treat one another with tenderness, and love one another fiercely. Bearing Christ's love in these ways, we pray to be God's faithful witnesses.



The United Methodist Book of Discipline (pp 95-96) describes this covenantal relationship this way:

In covenant with God and with each other:

- We affirm our unity in Christ, and take faithful steps to live more fully into what it means to be a worldwide church in mission for the transformation of the world.
- We commit ourselves to crossing boundaries of language, culture, and social or economic status. We commit ourselves to be in ministry with all people, as we, in faithfulness to the gospel, seek to grow in mutual love and trust.
- We participate in God's mission as partners in ministry, recognizing that our God-given gifts, experiences, and resources are of equal value, whether spiritual, financial, or missional.
- We commit ourselves to full equity and accountability in our relationships, structures, and responsibilities for the denomination.
- We enter afresh into a relationship of mutuality, creating a new sense of community and joyously living out our worldwide connection in mission for the transformation of the world.

#### Brentwood Community United Methodist Leadership Covenant in Carrying Out Our Mission in the World

[A Short Version of the Covenant] As leaders of Brentwood Community United Methodist Church, we covenant to pray, thanking God and seeking his direction; lead others by example through worship, generosity, discernment and support; care for one another while respecting our differences.

  - 1. Avoid self-destructive behavior (addictive behavior, poor self-care)

  - 4. Avoid malice (harboring resentment, acting in anger, backbiting, gossip)
  - 5. Avoid wasting of resources (the church's and personal resources of time, talent, finance)
- b. Do Good
  - 1.Live a life of love
  - 2. Share our faith inside and outside of our church
  - 3. Care for our families
  - 4. Build others up
  - 5.Be engaged with those in need
- c. Grow through Spiritual Disciplines
- d. 1.Attend worship service
  - 2.Engage in spiritual growth and accountability in a small group 3.Serve God with our time and talents
  - 4. Give in proportion to our income, with the tithe being the goal
  - 5. Spend time in prayer and the personal study of Scripture

  - 1. Humble (Servanthood)
  - 2. Positive
  - 3. Creative
  - 4. Committed to Love
  - 5. Supportive of the mission

  - 3. Maintaining appropriate confidentiality
  - 4. Going directly to the individual whenever a problem arises, then go to person in charge (\*Exception is when someone has a concern regarding any of the staff. In that case that person needs to go first to a liaison assigned by Staff Parish Relations Committee)
  - 5. Being helpful by attending meetings, offering hands, and communicating honestly for shortcomings
