† Pastor's Letter †

Dear Friends in Ministry

I have been a member of United Methodist Women (UMW) since 1987. I was a beneficiary of UMW mission through Ewah Women's University in Seoul in 1980 – 1984. I am so proud to be a part of this huge power house of God's mission. So I'd like to focus the whole month of May on their 150 years legacy as they celebrate it globally this year. I will preach on Women in the Bible on May 5th and 26th. For Mother's Day Sunday on May 12th, I invited a woman preacher from First UMC in Sacramento who is a certified candidate for ordained ministry in our Conference. And I will begin a Bible Study on 12 Women of the Bible: Life-Changing Stories for Women Today in June 6th: 3 pm – 4:30 pm Six Thursdays Beginning from June 6th. I am so excited to celebrate work of God done by women disciples throughout history. A little bit of introduction of UMW legacy is here:

1869: 8 women - - - - - Today: 800,000 members!!!

In 1869, women and children were legally classified as "chattel, legally dead, non-persons" (<u>https://www.unitedmethodistwomen.org/about/history</u>). Eight women in Boston gathered together and formed the Methodist Woman's Foreign Missionary Society (WFMS) in March, 1869 (see the photo below). Mrs. Butler



told about the desperate spiritual and physical needs of women in India. A male doctor could not treat women at the time. Schooling for girls was almost non-existent. Single, trained and dedicated women were needed for medical and educational work. By November 1869, the newly formed organization raised funds and sent Isabella Thoburn, an educator, and Dr. Clara Swain, a doctor, to India.

UMW has become the largest denominational faith organization for women with approximately 800,000 members. Members raise up to \$20 million each year for programs and projects related to women, children and youth in the United States and in more than 100 countries around the world.

United Methodist Women and The United Methodist Church's principles and values include:

- Promoting the empowerment of women, children and youth.
- Promoting anti-racism and multiculturalism.
- Promoting inclusion and equity.
- Promoting fair labor practices.
- Promoting economic and environmental stewardship and sustainability.

"United Methodist Women shall be a community of women whose *purpose* is to know God and to experience freedom as whole persons through Jesus Christ; to develop a creative, supportive fellowship; and to expand concepts of mission through participation in the global ministries of the church."

On behalf of BCUMC, I'd like to thank all members of UMW in our church for all their loving service for missions and ministries near and far. We love and respect you for all you are and all you do! May God continue to bless our UMW 150 years more and forever!

Rejoice in all circumstances, pray without ceasing, and give thanks always!


We did it! The whole congregation completed reading of the Bible cover to cover during 2019 Lent by taking different chapters individually! The person who read the most was

We will be collecting feedback for the next month. We will then take all your ideas and come up with a few options for a congregational vote.


