Online Giving Update




For church members and friends who are looking to donate to the church and its programs online, our new online giving platform is VANCO (previously PayPal).

PRESS RELEASE REGARDING BOY SCOUTS OF AMERICA

[1] Press Release January 27, 2022

Sacramento, CA - The California-Nevada Conference's Appointive Cabinet, Core Team, Board of Trustees, and Council on Finance and Administration recently met to affirm their commitment to the healing and support of abuse survivors specifically related to claims against the Boy Scouts of America.

As part of the Boy Scouts of America proposed bankruptcy settlement, all 54 U.S. annual conferences are being asked to contribute toward a \$30 million settlement amount. This settlement is part of a larger bankruptcy reorganization plan for the Boy Scouts of America for which approval is still pending by the US Bankruptcy Court. The \$30 million amount has been allocated among annual conferences based upon the number of claims associated with their respective churches. The California-Nevada Conference has been allocated the amount of \$572,264.

On Saturday, January 22, 2022, this team of Conference leaders unanimously agreed that the California-Nevada Conference shall fulfill the requested financial commitment and that our conference leadership will report to the Annual Conference Session in June 2022, how this commitment is to be funded. ...

[2] Press Release February 15, 2022

The United Methodist Church and the Boy Scouts of America have worked together to develop the character and values of youth through a more than 100-year relationship. The young people have become leaders in communities, education, industry, and public service. Building on the foundation of the Scout Oath and Law, young people have also grown in their duty to God, country, and self. On behalf of the Boy Scouts of America and The United Methodist Church, we thank you, the leaders who serve to further the aims of Scouting and support and develop young people.

Charter Renewal Is Now Extended Through June 30, 2022

The UMC and the BSA are continuing to develop a long-term solution regarding the church's relationship with Scouting in service to youth. As we move forward, we recognize that changes are needed. We are thankful that we are working together to improve the program and safety of Scouting for future generations of young people.

To plan for and carry out the new relationship agreements, the leadership of BSA and the UMC have agreed that it is best for all, and especially Scouts, to extend the effectiveness of all existing charters from March 31, 2022, through June 30, 2022. This will provide for uninterrupted ministry with young people through Scouting. Membership Renewal Should Be Moving Forward

We are also reaching out jointly today for an additional and very important reason: namely, to be clear that the annual <u>membership</u> renewal process for all youth and adults who participate in Scouting programs <u>should be moving forward</u>, notwithstanding our agreement to continue the pause on charter renewal through June 2022. Charter renewal and membership renewal are related but distinct processes. Charter renewal focuses on the organization-to-organization relationship. This relationship is extended without any action required. Membership renewal involves the relationship between individual Scouts and volunteers and the BSA.

We welcomed about a dozen new volunteers in various locations, some for just a day or two, others may stay longer. We said so long to **Jerry Walton** (former director), **Shirley Peluso** (clothing & food bags), and **Bill Morris** (outside helper and all around do anything that's needed angel).

HOPE House would not be possible without our amazing volunteers!

We STILL NEED VOLUNTEERS!

Here are our crucial volunteer positions:

- Computer positions on both Monday and Wednesday. We need individuals who know basic Excel to complement both Shirley and Joy's schedules for every other Monday or Wednesday position from 8:30 am to 12:30 p.m.
- Friday food pick up at the Church of the Latter-Day Saints in Antioch every Friday from 8:30 1030 a.m. approx. strong arms, back and truck, if possible.
- Wednesdays 8:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. Clothing Ministry

Please consider supporting these local generous businesses (all found online) who are helping HOPE House:

- SAFEWAY will provide HOPE House with a \$3000 grant!
- RODDA Electric will donate its services to upgrade electrical to the refrigerators and computer station.

- Elite Defense Security Solutions provided us with a free security assessment and Scheer Security will provide us with a free security system and discounted central system monitoring
- Head Out Hauling will donate its hauling services to take away items that people dump at HOPE House.
- 110 Magazine plans to write a feature article on the HOPE House later in the year

What we currently need: HOPE House will spend about \$25,000 this year. Half of this will be on food, the other half on operating expenses such as PGE, water, garbage, sewer, and items that keep us operational. No donation is too small. Every donation is deeply appreciated.

Adopt a month of garbage/water/sewer costs at about \$150/month

Adopt a month of PGE at about \$450/month or \$100/week

Adopt a month of food costs approx. \$1000 month or \$250/week

Paper towels, toilet paper, napkins, hot/cold cups



Lent begins with Ash Wednesday. "We confront our mortality and confess our sin before God within the community of faith." Ash Wednesday is about death, first of all, because this journey of being born anew to a living hope in Jesus Christ requires that we also die

with him, "buried with him in baptism." Starting with powerful reminders of our mortality reminds us our work of accompanying others toward baptism and personal spiritual disciplines during this season are not a kind of "self-help" or "up by our own bootstraps" exercise. We do not "take on" spiritual exercises. We *submit* more profoundly to the use of the means of grace. We do not "make ourselves better." Rather, we open ourselves more profoundly to the operations of divine grace. We do not "hang tight" to make ourselves get better. We let go, trusting God, through submitting to these means, to make us more holy.



COVID-19 GUIDELINES UPDATED (March 1st, 2022)

"Do No Harm, Do Good, Stay in Love with God Always!"

(General Principal of Wesleyan Methodist Discipleship)

- 1. In alignment with state requirements Contra Costa County has lifted universal mask requirements for vaccinated people in most indoor public settings.
- 2. For our public worship, we strongly suggest mask wearing for all, vaccinated or not, during the service and fellowship, with the exception that worship ministers (speakers or singers who are vaccinated) can take off their masks during speaking or singing and put back their masks on when they are done, and when eating or drinking. We must keep in mind that many members of our congregation are immunocompromised, and some have battled this disease and are concerned about re-infection.
- 3. For the safety of all, we continue to respect each person's choice to wear or not wear a mask in any circumstances. No one should be asked 'why?'
- 4. For the safety of all, anyone who has fever or sick should stay at home.
- 5. We allow people to bring home-made food to church or to cook in the church kitchen while only designated servers serve participants.
- 6. Regarding vaccination check, we will operate this guideline through an honor system. We will not demand to show any vaccination proof at the door or during the meeting to honor each participant's privacy and integrity.
