

† Pastor's Letter †

Dear All,

November was filled with unexpected troubles and incidents for my family! I was sick more than two weeks with terrible cold (not COVID-19) and unfortunately delivered a sermon with a horrific broken voice on November 6th. Then I got a call from my husband on November 13th Sunday at 2 pm that he got into a car accident on Highway 4. I thought he was not seriously injured because he was conscious and he himself called me. About 5 minutes later, he called me again and told me the exact same message. He didn't remember that he called me 5 minutes earlier. At that moment, I realized that he was in a deep shock and might have been seriously injured. It turned out that a half of his 8 rib bones (on the left side) were all gone (shattered unreparable) and his collar bone and shoulder bone broken. He had an 8-hour surgery next day to recreate rib-bones with Titanium.

Everybody prayed for him and my family... from Brentwood, Stockton Central, Concord, Santa Clara, Marina, DSs, colleagues and friends, family in Korea, Japan, and Chicago... My mind was all over the places... hard to focus on prayers... it was such a comfort to know hundreds of prayer-warriors praying for him.



Unbelievable... on Tuesday (the day after the surgery), Sungho could talk to me and even smiled at me. Unbelievable... on Wednesday, he could sit up almost all day, eat all three meals with much appetite... Unbelievable... on Thursday, doctors sent him home with prescription of Tylenol and Advil...

Unbelievable... on Friday, he went to the park and walked a half mile and stop taking any medication... He is now walking 3 miles a day without any problem!

People say it is unbelievable... but the truth is ... you prayed for his "speedy recovery," "painless recovery," "amazing healing," so you are all responsible for such speedy recovery by the grace of God!

Then, Linda Beautiful and Linda Wonderful, on behalf of CCN, delivered a full package of Holiday Meal and my family enjoyed it on Thanksgiving Day! Pea-soup, delivered by Barbara Pinkston, was so delicious...we enjoyed it to the last drop of it!

Approximately 80% of our income comes from pledges and non-pledge donations. The remaining 20% is generated from facility use and miscellaneous income and is estimated to be \$40,000 for 2023. MINUTES OF 2022 CHURCH CONFERENCE

Rev. Hyesung Lee, Pastor

November 27, 2022, 12:00 P.M.

1. **Welcome and Introductions:** Pastor Lee welcomed everyone and introduced Rev. Laumanu Ika. Pastor Lee also explained that she will be presiding at the Martinez Tongan UMC Charge Conference where Rev. Ika is Pastor. Due to Pastor Lee's husband's injuries incurred from an auto accident two weeks ago that conference had to be delayed.
2. **Call to Order:** Rev. Ika called the meeting to order at 12:06 P.M. He explained that the purpose of the Charge Conference is to celebrate the work for the Lord this church has done – the number of baptisms, reception of new members, celebration of new members, care within the community and love to one another.
3. **Election of Secretary for Church Conference:** Rev. Ika explained that a Secretary for the Church Conference needs to be elected. Michael Ann Honea is the nominee for Secretary. A Motion was made, seconded and passed. Michael Ann was approved as the Secretary.
4. **Membership Report:** Membership Secretary JoAnn Funk presented the report:
 - a. Since the last Conference we have gained 14 new members and removed 4 members due to death.
 - b. A correction was made for two members whose names were omitted from the record. The current total number of members is 155.
 - c. JoAnn stated that Larry Schaffer will become the Membership Secretary as of 2023.
 - d. A Motion was made, seconded and passed to accept the Membership Report.
5. **Approval of the 2023 Clergy Compensation** – Fran Bowman did the presentation for Heidi Stark, SPRC Chair (See attached):
 - a. Dave Funk explained that because Pastor Hyesung Lee of BCUMC and her husband, Pastor Sungho Lee of Central Valley Church in Stockton, CA., live in the parsonage belonging to BCUMC, expenses for health insurance and parsonage expenses are shared with both churches.
 - b. GRAND TOTAL OF ALL CLERGY COMPENSATION AMOUNTS, PLUS HEALTH INSURANCE AND EXPENSE REIMBURSEMENT COSTS FOR PASTOR HYESUNG LEE IS \$87,845.23. THERE WAS A MOTION MADE, SECONDED, AND PASSED TO APPROVE PASTOR LEE'S COMPENSATION PACKAGE.
6. **Election of Church Leaders (Nomination Report)** – Pastor Lee's Report (See attached- New committee members are highlighted in yellow).
 - a. Julius Lukacs, Lay Leader for 15 years, is stepping down. Dave Funk, Lay Leader for three years, will remain as Lay Leader; Heidi Stark will leave SPRC and become a Lay Leader; Fran Bowman will leave Finance and become Chair of SPRC; Diego Garcia will become Church Treasurer.
 - b. Board of Trustees: Nominees as new members: Dennis Buckley, Den Bowman, and Eugene Davis. Passage read by Pastor Lee – "I move that the Secretary cast a ballot favoring the nominees for the Board of Trustees and the Secretary note in the minutes that the nominees were elected by ballot".
 - c. There was a ballot vote for New Members of Board of Trustees. There were 18 people attending this conference. There were 18 ballot votes cast – all votes were "yes". The three nominees, Dennis Buckley, Den Bowman, and Eugene Davis, were approved as members of Trustees Committee.

- d. Nomination Committee: Eileen Newill's name was left off of the Nomination Committee List in error.
 - e. Nomination Committee: Nominations report was approved.
7. **Benediction:** Rev. Ika spoke about the support of the congregation at BCUMC and love of the Pastor and Church, the support of this Conference event, saying we are witnesses of God and thanking us for love of the church and the impact made to the people of this community.
The Charge Conference ended at 12:35 P.M.

Trustee Report

The Trustees have mainly dealt with a water leak on the end of the Sunday School building and with lingering issues involving our relationship with the Boy Scouts.

1. The water leak. Our plumber is to start to work tomorrow (November 30) morning to replace the leaky pipe and fittings. We will not know what that will entail until he works on it. That building is on a slab. We believe that no pipe is either in or under the slab, because either of those will greatly increase the cost of repair. The trustees will be informed of the situation as it unfolds. So far, they have approved replacement of the pipes where the leak seems to be.

2a. Boy Scout problems from the past: As you may know, the Boy Scouts have been dealing with a lot of claims concerning alleged sexual abuse (oral and/or physical) suffered by boys from the actions of adult scout leaders. The national scout organization claimed that they could not afford to pay all the claims arising from this, they declared bankruptcy and all claims are now going through the US bankruptcy court in Delaware. Claims were widely solicited and after much negotiation, a proposed settlement has been reached. A hearing on it will be held on December 21 and the judge will issue an opinion in late February or sometime in March. We are involved because at least one of the claims alleges the abuse happened in the troop sponsored by our church. How much we shall owe will not be known until after the judge's opinion is released.

2b. Supporting Boy Scouts in the present and in the future: To prevent getting into a similar situation in the future, the leadership of the Boy Scouts and a committee from the national UMC have come up with new rules for how units of each (troops and local churches) should use to relate to each other. The national UMC has advised us to use only the new method of relating while the local boy scout council (like our annual conference) will only use the old method, leaving us at an impasse. The trustees voted to end our relationship with the Boy Scouts effective October 31, 2022. The national organizations have recently notified us that all relationships based on the old method that still exist will be terminated on December 31, 2022. (As noted above, ours was terminated on October 31, 2022.) At the current time we have no relationship with the Boy Scouts and they should not be holding any meetings on our property.
As you can see the duties of the Trustees are not limited to building repair.



Adult Bible Studies Winter 2022-23 (Power & Love) December 4th through February 26th, 2023



Theme: Power and Love

This winter, our Bible lessons follow the theme “Power and Love.” The lessons first challenge us to try to understand Scripture, particularly the Nativity accounts, from the position of vulnerability and powerlessness. They then move to a closer look at what it means to belong to the family of God and culminate in a series of lessons on love and how it informs and changes our relationships. The writer of the student book is Sue Mink. Each week’s Student Book lesson lists background Scripture, features key verses, provides reliable and relevant biblical explanation and application, and more in a readable font size that is accessible to everyone. Included to help students go deeper into the lessons are:

A comprehensive Bible study plan with more flexibility in terms of Scripture selection and topics. Observation of the church seasons, including Advent and Lent. Suggestions for developing spiritual practices (prayer, confession, worship, mindfulness, solitude, community, hospitality, neighboring, service, and celebration).

No printed Scripture text allowing you to choose your own Bible translation.

COVID-19 GUIDELINES UPDATED (March 1st, 2022)

“Do No Harm, Do Good, Stay in Love with God Always!”

(General Principal of Wesleyan Methodist Discipleship)

1. In alignment with state requirements Contra Costa County has lifted universal mask requirements for vaccinated people in most indoor public settings.
2. For our public worship, we strongly suggest mask wearing for all, vaccinated or not, during the service and fellowship, with the exception that worship ministers (speakers or singers who are vaccinated) can take off their masks during speaking or singing and put back their masks on when they are done, and when eating or drinking. We must keep in mind that many members of our congregation are immunocompromised, and some have battled this disease and are concerned about re-infection.
3. For the safety of all, we continue to respect each person’s choice to wear or not wear a mask in any circumstances. No one should be asked ‘why?’
4. For the safety of all, anyone who has fever or sick should stay at home.
5. We allow people to bring home-made food to church or to cook in the church kitchen while only designated servers serve participants.
6. Regarding vaccination check, we will operate this guideline through an honor system. We will not demand to show any vaccination proof at the door or during the meeting to honor each participant’s privacy and integrity.

COVID-19 GUIDELINES will be displayed on each wall of the rooms in the church.
