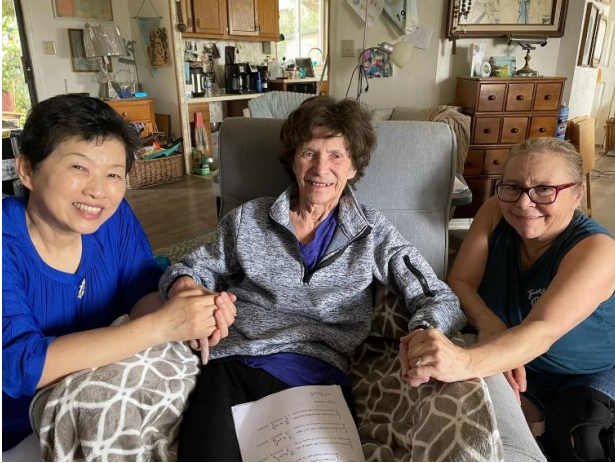
We will be taking a summer break with no meetings in July. Meetings will resume in August.

## **PRESS RELEASE on UMC Disaffiliation Process**

Sacramento, CA: The Conference Board of Trustees adopted a church disaffiliation agreement template during its meeting of May 25th. The agreement will be used for any church in our annual conference disaffiliating from the United Methodist denomination under ¶2553 of the Book of Discipline. The adopted agreement can be found [here](#).

The 2019 Special General Conference adopted [¶2553 “Disaffiliation of a Local Church Over Issues Related to Human Sexuality.”](#) requiring the conference board of trustees of each annual conference to establish the terms and conditions for church disaffiliation in consultation with the cabinet, the annual conference treasurer, the annual conference benefits officer, the director of connectional ministries, and the annual conference chancellor. The process for church disaffiliation requires a two-thirds majority vote at a local church conference plus an affirmative “yes or no” vote from a simple majority at an Annual Conference Session. Church disaffiliations must be completed by December 31, 2023.

Under the adopted agreement, Cal-Nevada churches would be required to pay (1) any unpaid tithe for the past year (2) an additional year of tithe (3) its share of unfunded pension obligations (4) its share of the Annual Conference’s settlement amount in the Boy Scouts of America bankruptcy case (5) any unpaid property insurance due the Conference’s unit insurance program (6) any unpaid clergy compensation and benefits and (7) 20% of the fair market value of its property. The Conference would retain a right of first refusal on the property, giving it the right to repurchase the property at 20% of its fair market value if the church desires to sell the property in the 7 years after disaffiliation.

The disaffiliating church would be legally released from the United Methodist trust clause as described in ¶2501.1 of the Book of Discipline. Its 501(c)(3) tax exemption under the United Methodist group ruling would be removed. The disaffiliation process requires the local church to have a an audit by a CPA and an appraisal of its property by an independent appraiser.

## **Bishop Sally Dyck: Statement on the Supreme Court's decision to overturn Roe v. Wade**

On June 24, 2022 the Supreme Court of the United States overruled Roe v. Wade which established a constitutional right based on the 14<sup>th</sup> amendment to legalize abortion in 1973.

I was 20 years old at the time and I distinctly remember what my mother (a devout Mennonite woman) said to me, “Abortion should be legal but it’s not for us.” What she meant was that in spite of her beliefs about abortion being wrong, it should be legal for others. Throughout the years, I have believed that abortion should be safe, legal and rare.

Over the years more and more people like my mother have accepted Roe v. Wade until now it is 61% (or more in some surveys) of the US population. Plus, the number of abortions has significantly decreased, not increased with legalized abortion, and certainly fewer women have died as a result of abortion.

Over the years I, like many clergy, have counseled women and couples who are contemplating abortion due to their various circumstances, including the medical news that their unborn child may not be viable at birth or has severe health conditions that will be an infliction of pain and suffering. Others have experienced rape and incest or bearing the child would jeopardize the life of the mother. For these women and couples, abortion will be not legal for them in many states.

After the overturning of Roe v. Wade, I heard an article on NPR where an anti-abortion proponent was celebrating the “victory,” and his main message was that now people (and he implied mostly women) will need to take more personal responsibility for their behavior.

Emphasizing personal responsibility in regards to any social problem overlooks the major social responsibility that is needed: paid maternity leave for all, not just privileged women (many European nations have at least one year); maternal and early childhood health care, including the cost of the birth; and free childcare, to name a few.

With the overturning of Roe v. Wade, women’s rights and reproductive rights are in jeopardy. And there’s nothing to say that if there is an overturning of Congress at the mid-term, a federal law could make abortion illegal in all states.

The “original intent” philosophy that was used to overturn Roe v. Wade—meaning the Constitution didn’t consider abortion as a right in 1868—could also be used in the future by the Supreme Court for some other rights that we have come to accept and even rely upon, such as same-sex and inter-racial marriage.

Furthermore, the credibility of the Supreme Court is seriously jeopardized because several justices indicated in their confirmation hearings that they would not overturn precedent law, specifically Roe v. Wade. Their assurance influenced key votes in their confirmation.

The confidence in the Supreme Court has fallen to a very low 25% level in the US. It’s not lost on many citizens that this is the first time that major civil rights have been *denied* by the Supreme Court and that it targets the most vulnerable among us, particularly women, people of color and the poor. No matter how you feel about the overturning of Roe v. Wade, an additional cascade of reactions and outcomes are possible that will bring some turbulent times to our country, families, churches, and communities.

There are many statements from various United Methodist agencies and I encourage you to [read them](#).

I also encourage you to listen to the stories of your or your friends’ mothers and grandmothers who had to seek illegal abortions before 1973. Think about your daughters and granddaughters who may find themselves in difficult circumstances in the days and years ahead. Contemplate the reality of being generous toward others, especially those most vulnerable as a result of this landmark decision.

Since there is no “original intent” in the scriptures about abortion, I have not proof texted one, but I do believe that the underlying message of the scriptures is that we are to care for the most vulnerable in our midst and to find ways to live in a world of competing values and with neighbors who have different needs from our own. I go back to my mother’s words so many years ago. Even though she believed abortion was wrong, she didn’t deny that other women and families had different situations that required there to be safe, legal and rare abortions in our nation. Her faith was deep enough to love her neighbor.

Now it’s time for some of us to get to work for justice.

## COVID-19 GUIDELINES UPDATED (March 1<sup>st</sup>, 2022)

“Do No Harm, Do Good, Stay in Love with God Always!”

(General Principal of Wesleyan Methodist Discipleship)

1. In alignment with state requirements Contra Costa County has lifted universal mask requirements for vaccinated people in most indoor public settings.
2. For our public worship, we strongly suggest mask wearing for all, vaccinated or not, during the service and fellowship, with the exception that worship ministers (speakers or singers who are vaccinated) can take off their masks during speaking or singing and put back their masks on when they are done, and when eating or drinking. We must keep in mind that many members of our congregation are immunocompromised, and some have battled this disease and are concerned about re-infection.
3. For the safety of all, we continue to respect each person’s choice to wear or not wear a mask in any circumstances. No one should be asked ‘why?’
4. For the safety of all, anyone who has fever or sick should stay at home.
5. We allow people to bring home-made food to church or to cook in the church kitchen while only designated servers serve participants.
6. Regarding vaccination check, we will operate this guideline through an honor system. We will not demand to show any vaccination proof at the door or during the meeting to honor each participant’s privacy and integrity.

### HOPE House News

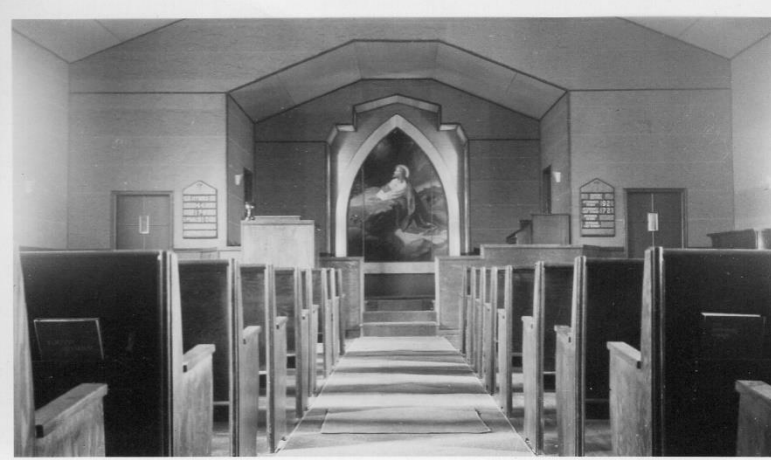

# 80 Years of Our Sanctuary's Changes

It is strange what you can discover when you are looking for something totally unrelated. I was looking in the church history file and accidentally found two black and white photographs of our Sanctuary taken about 40 years apart. I also added a recent photo for comparison. My thanks go out to **Vernon Noble**, past Church Historian, and long-time church member, for many of the details I describe. As you will see the Sanctuary was quite different from where we worship today.



This photo was taken in March 1938. The "Christ at Gethsemane" painting was mounted in a lighted recess and was lower on the wall. There were small Sunday School classrooms on both sides of the chancel. (The office area had not yet been built on the east end of the building.) If you look to the right of the painting and you can see an organ up against the wall of the Sunday School room. If you look carefully at the center aisle, you will see a piece of carpet covering the grill of the old floor furnace.

Vernon Noble told me that the furnace was

so inefficient that the pastor had to come down to the church and turn on the heat at 3:00AM for the church to be warm for the worship service.

This photo was taken in December of 1975. Changes made in the 1950s removed the recess that enclosed the painting and removed the walls from the Sunday School room on the right to provide space for the choir. You can see a low wall behind the back row of the choir. In those days the choir robes were kept in the area where our Pastor's office is now. There was a door from that room into the church and the choir walked through the door directly onto the worship platform. There was no processional from the back as we have now.



Now, advance 46 years and we have what you see today. In 1983 the Sanctuary was renovated. The low ceiling over the altar and choir area was removed and the painting raised. The walls and ceiling were stripped, and new electrical hardware and insulation was installed. The choir gained a fifth row and the room where the choir robes were kept became the Pastor's office. Three years later, the old pews were replaced.
