Dear Friends in Ministry

## **COVID-19 GUIDELINES UPDATED (March 1st, 2022)**

"Do No Harm, Do Good, Stay in Love with God Always!"

(General Principal of Wesleyan Methodist Discipleship)

- 1. In alignment with state requirements Contra Costa County has lifted universal mask requirements for vaccinated people in most indoor public settings.
- 2. For our public worship, we strongly suggest mask wearing for all, vaccinated or not, during the service and fellowship, with the exception that worship ministers (speakers or singers who are vaccinated) can take off their masks during speaking or singing and put back their masks on when they are done, and when eating or drinking. We must keep in mind that many members of our congregation are immunocompromised, and some have battled this disease and are concerned about re-infection.
- 3. For the safety of all, we continue to respect each person's choice to wear or not wear a mask in any circumstances. No one should be asked 'why?'
- 4. For the safety of all, anyone who has fever or sick should stay at home.
- 5. We allow people to bring home-made food to church or to cook in the church kitchen while only designated servers serve participants.
- 6. Regarding vaccination check, we will operate this guideline through an honor system. We will not demand to show any vaccination proof at the door or during the meeting to honor each participant's privacy and integrity.

September is a big birthday month for BCUMC staff! We send birthday wishes to accompanist, Lugh Baxter on September 6<sup>th</sup>, Keith Hicks our custodian on September 15<sup>th</sup>, and our Office Administrator, Michelle Carrillo will celebrate her birthday on September 17th! Happy Birthday to all these valued staff members! In August we were blessed to have Rev. Mary Elyn Bahlert share her sermons with us. For September, we will have two guest preachers, Rev. James Crawford and Rev. Hugh Stevenson each for two weeks. We look forward to hearing what they both will share with us.

Rev. James Crawford will preach the first two Sundays of September. Rev. Crawford's family was originally from North Carolina but moved around a lot while he was young. He landed in California at age 12. James attended college at Fresno State and the Mennonite Brethren Biblical Seminary in Fresno. His first appointment was at Wesley Modesto. While he was there, he helped start a garden for the Cambodian and Hmong people which grew into a farmer's market, and he also served at the interfaith food bank. James next moved on to Newcastle where he was part of a program that helped other churches rebuild and renew their parsonages and Church buildings. He also helped start a senior center that provided meals and fellowship for seniors in Newcastle. His first two appointments were in rural areas, but in 1991, James was asked by the Cabinet to go to San Jose First UMC the very day the Church burned to the ground! James felt called to San Jose First UMC even though he knew it would be a very different experience from his past appointments. There was much work to do - not just rebuilding physically but expanding ministries and outreach to the community from this very urban Church. James spent 22 years in San Jose only leaving when his health forced him to take disability leave. He retired at this year's Annual Conference after 43 years of service. James is married to Divina Rosa. We are pleased to welcome James to our pulpit. For the last two Sundays of September, we welcome back our friend, Rev. Hugh Stevenson. Hugh and his wife, Angela moved to the Summerset community in 2021 and attend here regularly. Hugh had successful hip surgery in July, and we are thankful for his recovery. Hugh is a retired Episcopal priest originally from the UK where he graduated from Westcott House Seminary in Cambridge. He has filled in for Pastor Lee on a couple of occasions and provided meaningful sermons. We look forward to hearing his messages for us this month.





# Do You Know What is CERTIFIED LAY MINISTER? See if This is for YOU!



#### Growing in your faith

Lay Servant Ministries is one of the significant lay leadership development programs available within the United Methodist connection. Through this system of equipping and empowering, lay servants have the opportunity to grow as disciples of Jesus Christ who then go and make other disciples...

#### Certified Lay Minister Overview

A Certified Lay Minister (CLM) is called and equipped to preach the Word, conduct public worship, care for the congregation, develop faith communities, lead small groups, or establish community outreach ministries as part of a ministry team with the supervision and support of a clergyperson. Much like a class leader in early Methodism, the Certified Lay Minister enhances the quality of ministry to small-membership churches as part of a circuit or cooperative parish or by expanding team ministry in other churches and charges. As with lay ministry in early Methodism, the certified lay minister expresses his or her gifts as evidence of God's grace.

A CLM is a layperson certified for intentional leadership and assigned by the District Superintendent to a congregation or ministry. A CLM does not replace clergy — but works with clergy so that the congregation has the leadership necessary for vital mission and ministry. They must be part of a ministry team. (Adapted from the Certified Lay Ministry Guidelines 2017, by Discipleship Ministries)

#### Becoming a Certified Lay Minister

There will be soon courses for Certified Lay Ministry beginning in January 2023.

This 5-month course will take participants through all the modules needed to become a Trained/Certified Lay Minister. Registration will begin in the fall.

In order to be considered for this cohort, applicants must be Certified Lay Servants and have completed six (6) additional advanced lay servant courses. All of these courses are currently scheduled to take place before the start of the CLM Course in January.
