## † Pastor's Letter †

Dear Family of God

In April, we go through the main peak of Jesus' journey on the earth – **Palm Sunday, Holy Thursday** (Foot Washing, Institution of Holy Communion and betrayals), **Good Friday** (Jesus' death), and **Easter** (Jesus' Resurrection)! There are a lot, perhaps too much still – after having gone through the same narrative for decades in my life – to process to understand the meanings of all in there. At the end, however, I (and we) arrive at the ultimate positive place in the presence of the living God. **Ultimate positivism** is the attitude that we believers hold with much doubts and struggles. It is not easy to stand on the ultimate positive ground. However, we strive to accept that believing God means standing on the light even in darkness, on the hope even in despair, and on the peace even in turmoil. If there is spiritual mathematics, the answer to our life equation cannot be negative but rather always positive because God is with us, Emmanuel. Without this conviction no faith journey can begin.

Before my husband and I were presented as the candidates for ordination 30 years ago, we took psychological tests like MMPI, 16PF, COBRAS, etc. After the results were revealed, I got approved easily. But the psychologist said that Sungho was too “positive” to become a pastor. It could be just one person's opinion. But his opinion with the test results was strong enough to send him to CPE (Clinical Pastoral Education) before ordination. For CPE, my husband had gone through 3-month-intensive training under a supervising chaplain with many other pastoral interns, working at the hospital every day for 8 hours. He served countless families who just lost their loved ones and those who had gone through too much sufferings. His reactions and words were reported in written verbatim every week for the whole team to discuss. He was constantly evaluated and constructively criticized. After three months, his supervisor invited him to join his team permanently. His ultra positive attitude was never a problem. I guess it was more needed in such a place full of crisis, sadness and grief. His ultra-positive attitude has never left him up until today. Maybe that was why he could recover so quickly from surgery for his 8 broken-ribs from the car accident in November 2022.

His positivism has not been so attractive to me most of time. In all circumstances, I usually think of the worst case and focus on how to prevent such a case from happening. The more I age, however, the more I see that his ultra-positive place is the space I need to be. Everything in the world seems working against hope too often these days! Without God's super-ultra-positivism, we may fall into a deep depression and lose our minds. There is no answer to today's world except God's 'YES' and Christ's unconditional grace which restores everything from darkness to light, from death to life and from ash to spirit!

Come, join us in our faith journey and experience God's 'YES' through Good Friday Service and Easter Sunrise/Morning Worship!

He is risen, risen indeed!

Halleluiah!

I hope your Lenten journey is providing you with opportunities to learn and grow in your faith. I'm enjoying the 2023 Lenten Bible Challenge. While I found some passages in Romans to be difficult, I also found verses of great comfort, and I know that nothing can separate me from the love of God or block my access to God.

Salvation – the “Living Water” offered by Jesus is available to all who are willing to trust and believe. We live in a fallen world, and we must choose how to live - choose whether to focus on earthly/material things or to focus on spiritual things. These aren't always easy choices, and we need God's guidance – the Holy Spirit's direction to keep us on the right path. We must acknowledge that we can't do it on our own and humbly turn to God time and time again and ask for guidance. Jesus is our example of true humility – caring more about others than himself, Jesus died bravely on the cross for our salvation. That's Amazing Grace! The challenges and obstacles in our daily lives are real! Sometimes, we want lightning bolt moments so that we know for sure that we are doing what the Holy Spirit intends for us; we want to know that God is guiding us. Often, we just aren't sure because we struggle daily with doubts and fears and how to live and act in this fallen world, but that is ok! I think when we acknowledge or questions our doubts, fears, and failings we are opening ourselves up God and allowing the Spirit to work in us and through us. Just keep going, just keep asking God for guidance and trust that you are making a difference.

### **How are we doing?**

Dave Funk and I are meeting monthly with Pastor to discuss and plan ways to come together and ways to reach out. **We need your help.** Please let us know how we are doing. Look for a little black box in the sanctuary – it's a locked box that Dave and I will access regularly. You can confidentially leave messages or prayer requests – whatever you want us to know. We're hoping that you will let us know your hopes and dreams for BCUMC. Also, let us know what you like or don't like (sermons are too short or too long, more music, less music, study ideas, small group ideas, fellowship ideas, etc....) Your input will inform our actions and we want to make sure we are accurately reflecting the wants and needs of our congregation.

We are acting on the feedback we are receiving, and changes are happening – more inclusive language, adjustments in sermon length, music requests (see separate article), more social events (see news about Sunday Night Live), newspaper advertisements, banners, one email on Friday with a message from Pastor and the bulletin and announcements attached. We're continuing to look for ways to increase our presence in the community. Please continue to think about who we are as a Church and how you can help us transform hearts and minds. In a recent sermon, Pastor asked why do we do what we do? The answer is that we believe that our small acts of love, when done with great faith can make a difference. The purpose of all we do individually or as a church should be to lift each other up and strengthen our faith. We want to spread the good news of Jesus and bring glory to God.

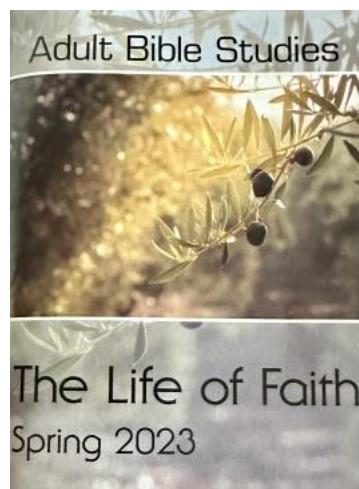
