I participated in 2023 Church Leadership Training (virtual), done for January 27 (6pm-8 pm) and 28 (9am-1pm), total 6 hours. More than 6 people from our church have participated in the training. - Promote unity in the church with open and clear communication.
- Confer with the staff on the effectiveness of their roles, especially in the use of their gifts, skills and time, and any possible impediments to their effectiveness.
- Routine evaluations, clergy housing, salary recommendations and job descriptions.

SPRC does not manage employees on a day-to-day basis. At BCUMC, all staff positions report to the Pastor with input from appropriate committees, and SPRC acts as liaisons; we are the link between the Pastor, the staff, the congregation, and the District Superintendent. As in all committees, information discussed/shared in our meetings should be treated as confidential. If you have any questions, please don't hesitate to reach out to anyone on our committee.

2023 Lenten Bible Challenge



Lent is a season of 40 days, not counting Sundays, which begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday. In Christian tradition, people abstain from entertainment, sensual pleasures and worldly desires during Lent. Many Christians use this time to prepare their body, mind, and spirit to be baptized on Easter.

We want to spend this Lenten journey with **Paul's Letter to Romans** (16 chapters) and **Gospel according to Luke** (24 chapters). We will

have 40 chapters to read each day of Lent. You will also be given 3 questions each day to meditate on the given chapter. You are invited to write your thoughts on the given paper. Here are guidelines:

- 1. Each Sunday a weekly schedule (a chapter and three questions for the day) will be available with Sunday Bulletin (*This will be also available through Friday Email)
- 2. Each day, read the chapter of the day, and write your answers to three questions on the weekly schedule (this will be your weekly journal). There is no right or wrong answer. You can also write any questions on the journal instead of answers.
- 3. You have three choices regarding what to do with your journal as below:
 - a. You may keep your journey to yourself
 - b. You may bring your weekly journal to church and put it in a designated box in the Narthex (This will be read by the pastor and some will be shared with the congregation through zoom meetings or pastor's messages).
 - c. You may join **a zoom meeting** on the following days to share your thoughts and journey with others. If you want to join in this zoom meeting, let pastor Lee know (<u>hslee3@gmail.com</u>) by Ash Wednesday (02.22.2023)
 - i. March 5 (Sunday) 7:00 pm to 8:00 pm
 - ii. March 19 (Sunday) 7:00 pm to 8:00 pm

- 4. You may do this together with your loved ones at home. This can be your Lenten *Family* Journey!





Adult Bible Studies Winter 2022-23 (Power & Love) December 4th through February 26th, 2023



Theme: Power and Love

This winter, our Bible lessons follow the theme "Power and Love." The lessons first challenge us to try to understand Scripture, particularly the Nativity accounts, from the position of vulnerability and powerlessness. They then move to a closer look at what it means to belong to the family of God and culminate in a series of lessons on love and how it informs and changes our relationships. The writer of the student book is Sue Mink. Each week's Student Book lesson lists background Scripture, features key verses, provides reliable and relevant biblical explanation and application, and more in a readable font size that is accessible to everyone. Included to help students go deeper into the lessons are:

A comprehensive Bible study plan with more flexibility in terms of Scripture selection and topics. Observation of the church seasons, including Advent and Lent. Suggestions for developing

spiritual practices (prayer, confession, worship, mindfulness, solitude, community, hospitality, neighboring, service, and celebration).

No printed Scripture text allowing you to choose your own Bible translation.

COVID-19 GUIDELINES UPDATED (March 1st, 2022)

"Do No Harm, Do Good, Stay in Love with God Always!"

(General Principal of Wesleyan Methodist Discipleship)

- 1. In alignment with state requirements Contra Costa County has lifted universal mask requirements for vaccinated people in most indoor public settings.
- 2. For our public worship, we strongly suggest mask wearing for all, vaccinated or not, during the service and fellowship, with the exception that worship ministers (speakers or singers who are vaccinated) can take off their masks during speaking or singing and put back their masks on when they are done, and when eating or drinking. We must keep in mind that many members of our congregation are immunocompromised, and some have battled this disease and are concerned about re-infection.
- 3. For the safety of all, we continue to respect each person's choice to wear or not wear a mask in any circumstances. No one should be asked 'why?'
- 4. For the safety of all, anyone who has fever or sick should stay at home.
- 5. We allow people to bring home-made food to church or to cook in the church kitchen while only designated servers serve participants.
- 6. Regarding vaccination check, we will operate this guideline through an honor system. We will not demand to show any vaccination proof at the door or during the meeting to honor each participant's privacy and integrity. COVID-19 GUIDELINES will be displayed on each wall of the rooms in the church.

Each committee/ministry is expected to conduct their own regular meetings and manage their tasks. The chairs of the various BCUMC committees and ministries are asked to attend Ad. Council meetings as voting members. Ad. Council is involved in the overall health of BCUMC and decisions that affect the whole body should be shared at Ad. Council.

The conference asks each Church to include five primary goals for the next five years on their Church profile on the conference website. All committees/ministries should keep these goals in mind as they meet and plan for the year. We should all be working towards meeting these goals. The goals BCUMC has listed are:

- 1. Envision, plan, and implement programs to nurture the outreach, witness, and family ministries in our Church. Encourage and expand youth participation. Evaluate the mission and ministry of our Church annually.
- 2. Establish the Church budget based on recommendations from the Finance Committee and insure adequate provisions for the financial needs of the Church.
- 3. Create a membership cultivation task force to grow membership thru community involvement. Participate in reconciling ministry and inter-faith activities in the community.
- 4. Fill committees with committed, participating members. Encourage all committees to meet regularly. Encourage leaders to attend district and conference trainings.
- 5. Improve our online presence and overall connection with our congregation and the local community.

Ad. Council meetings are scheduled for the second Wednesday of each month at 7pm in the Fireside Room. All are welcome to attend; however, only Ad. Council members may cast votes as necessary. The next Ad. Council meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, February 8th at 7pm.
