† Pastor's Letter †

Dear Family of God,

2023 California-Nevada Annual Conference was held June 15 (Thur) to June 18 (Sun) in Sacramento. More than 600 clergy and lay delegates attended for the business of the Annual Conference. It was a great joy to be there with our new Lay Delegate, Polly Gallagher. She presented an excellent report of the Conference to the



congregation during Sunday Worship Service on June 25th. One person said that she felt like she was right there as she listened to Polly's report. I am looking forward working with her again in 2024. The picture shows my husband rev. Sungho Lee (Central UMC, Stockton), myself in the middle and Polly Gallagher on the right with Interim Bishop Sally Dyck in pink outfit behind the table in the background.

Bishop Dyck acknowledged that our conference is still in turbulence due to the suspension of Bishop Minerva G. Carcaño

and the streaming of disaffiliations of UMCs. There was no talk at all about the trial of the bishop Carcaño even though we were surely in tense situation underneath... at least that's how I felt. So, Bishop Dyck invited a guest speaker, Rev. Rebekah Simon-Peter to speak about conflict resolution. She encouraged us to practice CALM in our conflicts:

Calm yourself – breathing, stretching...a new neuro path can be opened

Assess your automatic thoughts – your automatic reactions may not be what you intend to show, recognize your fear...and ask yourself "Is what I'm thinking really true?"

Listen to what actually said – Listen to bigger voice, true intention behind, not missing hint of hope...

Make a new choice – find a constructive response, follow things bigger than your fear

Bishop Sally mentioned that 2024 General Conference (the highest legislative body of UMC) will be held in April 23 – May 3, 2024 in Charlotte, North Carolina. It is expected to remove the paragraph ¶ 304.3 which states "The practice of homosexuality is incompatible with Christian teaching. Therefore, self-avowed practicing homosexuals are not to be certified as candidates, ordained as ministers, or appointed to serve in The United Methodist Church" along with some others that oppress the lives of lgbtqia+ siblings. It will work hard to "reset UMC" after painful divisions. So, let us pray for One Spirit to bless the whole body and help them to be the Body of Christ that keeps multiplying fruits of life and love all over the world.

The last Sunday of May was Pentecost Sunday, and we learned about Jesus' gift of the Holy Spirit to his disciples. That initial gift of the Holy Spirit came down on the disciples like tongues of fire and enabled them to speak in many languages. Everyone could hear God's message to them in their own language – it was personal to each of them, and it remains personal to us today. 



INSPIRED BY GOD, June 02 to August 2023

A comprehensive Bible study plan and spiritual practices to deepen your relationship with God. Inspired By God Student Booklet Donation of \$13.99

This summer, our Bible lessons follow the theme "Inspired by God" and help us look at the careful design of Scripture and the art and poetry through which it touches our hearts and minds. They then move into a consideration of one of Scripture's most practical categories, wisdom literature, followed by a look at some of Scripture's heroes, who might surprise us. The lessons in this unit look at some of the different kinds of writings we find in Scripture and how God speaks to us through writings such as the Law, the prophets, visions, and the psalms. They invite us to dwell within Scripture's reality rather than a reality of our own construction.

Wisdom, living with wisdom affects how we think, speak, act/behave, relate to God, and relate to others. What constitutes wisdom according to the Bible

is not conventional wisdom about how to stay safe and healthy or how to prosper in life. Conventional wisdom tells us not to give aid or comfort to an enemy, whereas biblical wisdom teaches us the opposite. Conventional wisdom tells us to store up our grain in barns for tomorrow, whereas biblical wisdom encourages us to share what we have with those whose need is for today.

Heroes and Anti-Heroes; The men and women of the Bible who "save the day" are not the typical heroes of Western mythology. They do not have superhuman powers; they are not mighty warriors; they are not descended from the gods. They are ordinary men and women who use their status and situation to serve God's purpose or people in need. The people who tradition prefers to make into heroes of kings and warriors frequently disappoint us by using their power to serve themselves.

Ellen Elain Rowan: OUR FIRST WOMAN PASTOR

Pastor Ellen Elaine Rowan, 85, went to be with her Lord, Wednesday June 7, 2023, in Morgantown, WV. She was born in Masontown, WV, on April 21, 1938.

Members of our church had to adjust to a new reality in 1982 when Ellen Rowan was appointed as our pastor. She was the first woman in that role in the nearly one hundred years the church had existed. A very few families had difficulty adjusting to this new situation and moved elsewhere. The rest found the change stimulating and challenging. Ellen was to stay for nine years, the longest tenure of any of our pastors to date. Ellen was born in Masontown, West Virginia in 1938. Her educational experiences led toward a career in both social work and the ministry. She was ordained in the Church of the Nazarene in 1961. She received her Master of Divinity degree summa cum laude from the Nazarene Theological Seminary

in 1970 after serving in a series of positions with the Nazarene Church. In 1971 she came to that denomination's Willow Creek site in northern California. Two years later she moved to the First Church of the Nazarene in Fremont. A personal decision led her to accept a pastorate at the Gridley United Methodist Church in 1980. In 1982 her orders were recognized by the United Methodist Church, and she was assigned to us in Brentwood.

There was a bit of the rebel in Ellen as we grew to know her. Some were startled to see her in her first year here riding around town on a motorcycle (without a helmet). Nevertheless, she turned out to be a fine preacher, one of the best we had known in many years. She was interested in liturgical matters and made a number of changes in that area of our worship. Several times she held healing services, anointing with oil and praying over those who came forward. I had been skeptical that such a service would be acceptable to our congregation but was surprised and impressed by the number of people who felt the need for this ministry.

Ellen's skills were not limited to the pulpit. After I retired as choir director in 1983 another director was hired. However, during a short trial period he was unable to produce adequate results. Ellen then took over the position and held it successfully until she left our church. She enjoyed entertaining and was responsible for organizing a few small group activities. One of these was the Writers' Group in which individuals read aloud articles or passages they had written. This group continues to meet regularly after more than fourteen years although it is no longer church-related. In 1991 Ellen chose somewhat reluctantly to accept an assignment at Chico Trinity UMC. Her move was a major shock to many of our congregation for her impact had been widely felt here. In Chico her influence has steadily grown. She also now serves on a number of California-Nevada Conference committees. Just recently at Chico State University she received the Maggie Award given to the A Community Woman of the Year. Ellen remembers her years in Brentwood with fondness. She has expressed her feelings as follows: The Brentwood Church and Community



constituted the warmest, most supportive and affirming community of which I've ever been part. Most of the best friends I've ever made are from Brentwood Church. I wanted to move on to a larger place where I'd have more opportunity and influence and I've had that here. I'm constantly quoted in the local newspapers and enjoy high visibility, but I've not been taken in by the congregation as part of the community as I was there. When I want the warm fuzzies I think of Brentwood and the people there, of our retreats and choir, our writers' group and parties at the parsonage, etc. etc.
