Lay Leader News By Heidi Stark

The last month has been filled with joy and sorrow for me and my family. My husband, Luiz and I have three grown children and three adorable grandbabies. We're empty nesters, but we share our home with our much-loved pets – our cat, Lucy (17 years old) and our Pomeranian, Teddy (9 years old). Lucy has always been an indoor kitty who occasionally ventures to our backyard, but Teddy would generally chase her back in on those rare occasions. On April 18, about 10pm, I let Teddy out before we went to bed, and Lucy apparently slipped out unseen. I didn't see her go out and I didn't know she was missing until the next morning. I searched the house and all her usual hiding places when I didn't find her inside, I moved to the garage and the yard – nothing. The search continued to our next-door neighbors, and soon we were searching all over our neighborhood. We put up fliers, posted with animal services, and on neighborhood networks. We followed advice hoping to lure her home and tracked down leads, but no Lucy. After three weeks, we



weren't hopeful that we would find her; it just seemed unlikely that a 17-year-old (that equates to about 100+ human years) pampered indoor kitty could survive the elements in the great outdoors. Now, through all of this I prayed. I had always imagined that Lucy would pass peacefully curled up cozy in the house never once did I envision her going missing. The not knowing was making me crazy. I believed that God was with her, and I prayed that if it was possible, she might be returned to us. So, on May 10, I was chairing Ad. Council; I had silenced my phone for the meeting, but I forgot to silence my watch (I believe that was a God moment!). My watch pinged during the meeting, and I looked down to see a picture of a cat that looked like Lucy. When I checked my phone, it was a Ring post from someone in our neighborhood who was reporting that a sweet cat had been in her yard for a few days. I was able to text and leave a message but got no immediate response. I got home and received a call from the woman; she invited Luiz and me to come to her house immediately to see if the cat was ours. This woman lives less than a half mile from our house in our neighborhood. After three weeks missing, we found Lucy in her backyard and brought her home! She let me pick her up and immediately started to purr. Once home, she was happily greeted by Teddy, and she started slowly moving through the house – like she couldn't believe she was home (We couldn't believe it either!). She has always been a tiny kitty, but she was very skinny and weak. Fortunately, she was uninjured and after just a few days of food, water, sleep and love she showed great improvement. I share this story because God is good; He hears our prayers!

Now, I wish I could end the story there on that happy note, but with joy often comes sorrow. In a shocking turn of events on Friday, May 19 just 9 days after we brought Lucy home, I walked into my home office to find my sweet Teddy unresponsive. The day had started out normally for us; Teddy had enjoyed a belly rub as I made the bed, and we had a quick game of fetch. The gardener arrived, and I went outside to chat with him. About 10am, I walked down the hall to my office to get to work. I expected to find Teddy waiting for me there – my little shadow and lazy office mate. When I came into the room, he didn't move to greet me, his tail didn't wag, he didn't lift his head and in one sickening moment I knew he was gone. I was hysterical; I called Luiz and he rushed home. In my hysteria I prayed, and I begged God to give me back my little dog. This was not what we ever expected; he was not sick and nine is not old for a Pomeranian. We expected to have many more years with our beautiful, clever, all-around great dog. Our vet believes he had a massive heart attack and passed peacefully. While I'm thankful he didn't suffer, I'm struggling with the why of this.

Did God give us back Lucy because he knew Teddy's time was short? I don't know the answers, and Luiz and I have been gutted by this loss. Teddy was so much a part of our family and our routines; he is everywhere I look, and I am so sad. Recently, Pastor spoke about heaven. I believe that heaven exists for all of God's creatures, and Luiz and I take comfort in thinking of Teddy playing ball in heaven with my Dad and Luiz's parents. I know that he is safe in Jesus' care. Grief is real and hard, and it's the price we pay for loving. I am



thankful to have loved that precious ball of fluff and to have been loved in return. While I don't understand the why of this, I do trust God, and I'm so thankful that I don't walk this life alone.

God never promised a life without trouble, but He did promise to never leave us and to walk through everything with us. No one escapes life unscathed; it's important to remember that everyone is carrying burdens. How we respond to the challenges in our life matters — will we be bitter or try to do better? Jesus lived a life of love and compassion for all creation, and we should follow his example. We know that death is not the end. We are merely visitors here until Jesus comes to take us home, but while we wait to go home, we can live a heaven filled life and show the best of ourselves to others so that they might come to know Jesus too. See you later Teddy! We loved you so — thanks for loving us!

How are we doing?

Dave Funk and I are meeting monthly with Pastor to discuss and plan ways to come together and ways to reach out. We need your help. Please let us know how we are doing. Look for a little black box in the sanctuary – it's a locked box that Dave and I will access regularly. You can confidentially leave messages or prayer requests – whatever you want us to know. We're hoping that you will let us know your hopes and dreams for BCUMC. Also, let us know what you like or don't like (sermons are too short or too long, more music, less music, study ideas, small group ideas, fellowship ideas, etc...) Your input will inform our actions and we want to make sure we are accurately reflecting the wants and needs of our congregation. We are acting on the feedback we receive, and things are happening! Change isn't always easy, but sometimes we need to experiment to find the best way forward. Our Worship Committee is proposing changes to our order of worship which will allow an additional hymn during service which has been a wish of many. We are continuing to look at ways to increase our presence in the community, and we ask you to please think about who we are as a Church and how we can work together to help transform hearts and minds and spread the good news of Jesus and bring glory to God.

Who showed fatherly kindness.


If there were difficult times

Brentwood Community Adult Bible Study Summer 2023



INSPIRED BY GOD, June 02 to August 2023

A comprehensive Bible study plan and spiritual practices to deepen your relationship with God. Inspired By God Student Booklet Donation of \$13.99

This summer, our Bible lessons follow the theme "Inspired by God" and help us look at the careful design of Scripture and the art and poetry through which it touches our hearts and minds. They then move into a consideration of one of Scripture's most practical categories, wisdom literature, followed by a look at some of Scripture's heroes, who might surprise us. The lessons in this unit look at some of the different kinds of writings we find in Scripture and how God speaks to us through writings such as the Law, the prophets, visions, and the psalms. They invite us to dwell within Scripture's reality rather than a reality of our own construction.

Wisdom, living with wisdom affects how we think, speak, act/behave, relate to God, and relate to others. What constitutes wisdom according to the Bible

is not conventional wisdom about how to stay safe and healthy or how to prosper in life. Conventional wisdom tells us not to give aid or comfort to an enemy, whereas biblical wisdom teaches us the opposite. Conventional wisdom tells us to store up our grain in barns for tomorrow, whereas biblical wisdom encourages us to share what we have with those whose need is for today.

Heroes and Anti-Heroes; The men and women of the Bible who "save the day" are not the typical heroes of Western mythology. They do not have superhuman powers; they are not mighty warriors; they are not descended from the gods. They are ordinary men and women who use their status and situation to serve God's purpose or people in need. The people who tradition prefers to make into heroes of kings and warriors frequently disappoint us by using their power to serve themselves.


