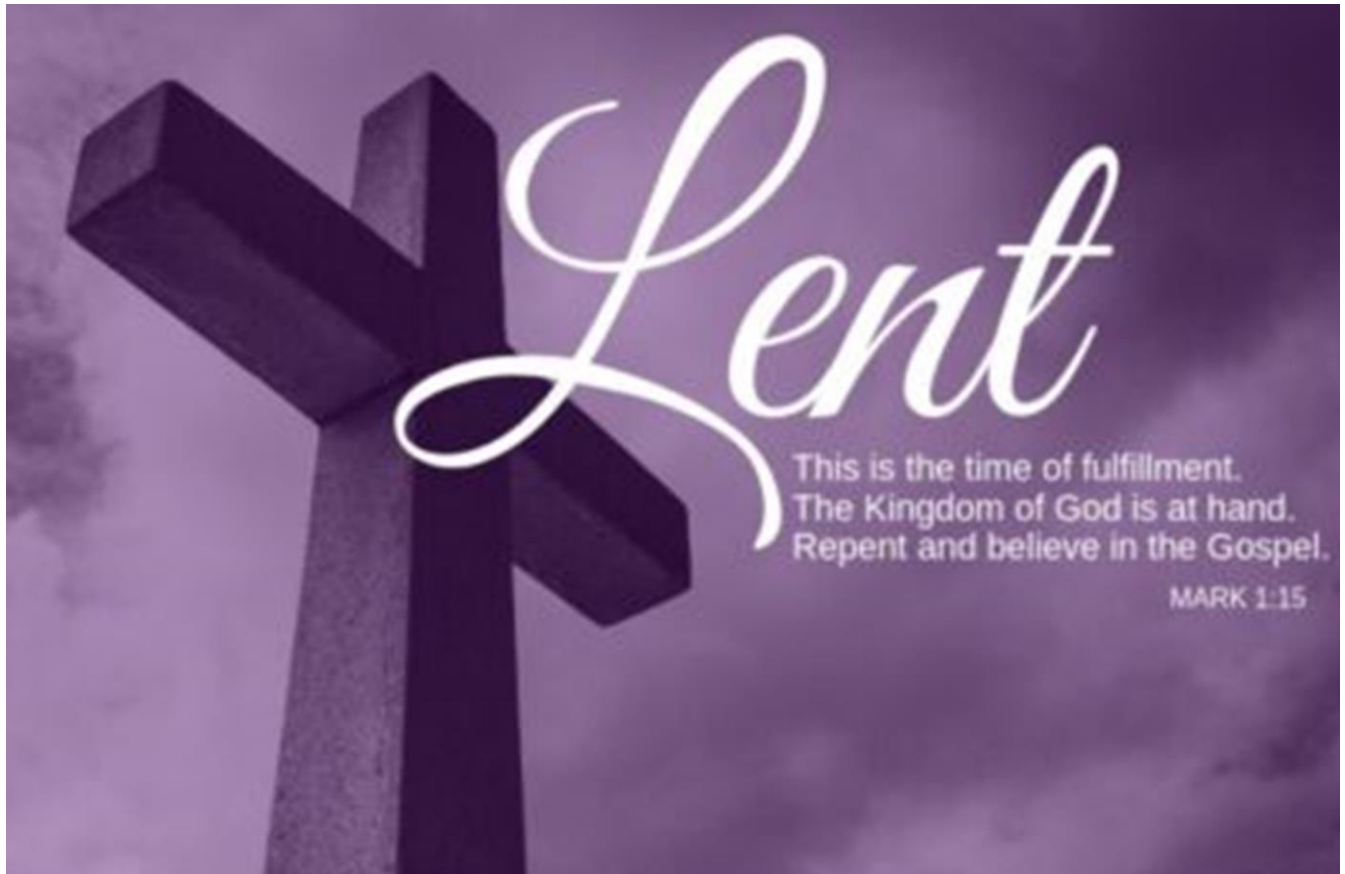

† Pastor's Letter †

Dear Family of God

Do you know why we call Sundays during Lent, <Sunday in Lent> rather than <Sunday of Lent>! It is because we the church traditionally consider all Sundays as <Little Easter> that belongs to Easter rather than Lent. So, all six Sundays, during Lent (from Ash Wednesday Feb 22 to Holy Saturday April 8), are <Sunday in Lent>. That is why we can sing little Hallelujah songs and happy joyful hymns during Sunday Worship even during the Lent Season.

Many people are participating in 2023 Lent Bible Challenge. Some have chosen to make it a family devotion at home. And 17 people have signed up so far for 3 zoom meetings for sharing and discussion on 3/5, 3/19 and 4/2 Sunday at 7 pm. We will share what verse/phrase was meaningful, in what way and if anyone has a question about anything. The Bible is the foundation for our faith journey. Without reading it, praying with it and discussing our inner thoughts and reactions with one another, our faith will not be anchored to the foundation that is Christ Jesus.

Our two Lay Leaders, David Funk and Heidi Stark, and I prepared a wonderful **Sunday Night Live** on February 26. We were disappointed for low attendance. But the dinner was fabulous with chicken noodle and minestrone soup, delicious breads, fruit and all kinds of desserts with a variety of drinks. Seven of us gathered and discussed on how we can provide more meaningful gatherings that could meet the needs of the congregation better. We also shared when/how God touched us and showed up in our time of challenges. God had shown up in a truck or in the vast ocean in their struggling times. Sometimes God nudges them to be more engaged in the ministry. For some, God showed up just to be there for them in the most difficult time of their lives. Personally, I really love when God confirms and affirms what I am doing as a pastor. I visit hospitals, rehab centers and senior living houses. It is my routine, nothing special about it. But some people are surprised to see me when I visit them. Some of them are so emotional and so appreciative of my presence there. Once in a while some react like they see Christ when I show up. Then my heart is filled with joy and gratitude, thinking “What am I? I am only a human. But they treat my visit as the most valuable thing for them.” At those moments, in those special spaces, there are only the patient, me and God. No one else knows about what is happening there! It doesn't matter! What matters is that three of us (God, me, and the child of God on the bed) love, value and support one another! This is what keeps me going!

Pastor/Staff-Parish Relations Committee (SPRC) – Connecting the Pastor, Staff & Congregation

As Fran reminded us last month, SPRC does not manage employees on a day-to-day basis. At BCUMC, all staff positions report to the Pastor with input from appropriate committees, and SPRC acts as liaisons; we are the link between the Pastor, the staff, the congregation, and the District Superintendent. This is my fourth year as a member of SPRC. During my time, I have been a liaison to the Staff Janitor as well as the Youth Director. I am currently serving as the liaison to our Youth Director, Cheryl Breitenbucher. Cheryl accepted the position in Fall of 2021 after our former youth director, Rebecca Feldermann, relocated out of state. Cheryl effortlessly stepped into this position and has been doing a great job with our youth over the past 1.5 years; planning and leading youth services, activities, and service projects in our community. If anyone in the congregation has any feedback or suggestions on the Youth Director position or youth activities and engagement, please reach out to me (miranda_harmonsmith@yahoo.com). I would love to hear from you.

Additionally, a few members of SPRC took part in this year's Church Leadership Training which took place virtually on January 27th and 28th. There was a 3-hour training session on Saturday, specifically aimed at SPRC committee members. The training highlighted SPRC-Clergy relationship expectations, characteristics of effective and ineffective SPRCs, resources available such as the "Guidelines-Pastor-Parish-Relations" booklet, as well as a quarterly calendar laying out SPRC responsibilities to be completed. This first quarter (January – March) SPRC tasks to be completed included: welcoming new members, setting member expectations, scheduling routine meetings (second Wednesday of the month at 4:30pm), establishing relationships with the staff to which we have been assigned as a liaison, and discussing/identifying ministry candidates within our congregation. A major take away from the training is that in order for SPRC to be successful, the lines between SPRC, the pastor, the staff and the congregation must be connected by clear and open communication and overall support.

Lent started on Ash Wednesday, February 22. What is Lent? It is the 40 days (excluding Sundays) leading up to Easter. We are reminded that Christ spent 40 days in the wilderness fasting and praying. We are called to open ourselves to God during Lent to examine our relationship with Him. We are to repent and turn to God, and Lent is a good time to reflect on the values and priorities in our lives. Many people give something up – make a sacrifice during the 40 days of Lent. Another option is to take on a spiritual discipline to draw nearer to God. I would like to encourage everyone to participate in the 2023 Lenten Bible Challenge put together by our Pastor Hyesung Lee and her husband, Rev. Sungho Lee. For the next 40 days, I'm making time in my schedule to do the reading and contemplate the three daily questions. I know that I will learn and grow from this experience. I hope you'll join me on this Lenten journey.

I also want to share what I've taken from Pastor's sermons during the month of February and how it relates to the goals of BCUMC to expand our membership and make our Church known in the community. I believe that we are to make BCUMC a delicious beacon in the community. We are called to be salt and light in the world. With faith we have peace. We can confidently say that we are loved by God and because of that we desire to share that love and joy with others. Being reconciled to God fills us with the Holy Spirit that lights us up and allows us to share the good news of a loving relationship with God. Of course, we live in this fallen world which means we will experience good days and bad days. We can't just worship God when things are going well and we're getting what we want? We are called to have faith in all circumstances and know that in good times or in bad, God walks with us through it all. During the Transfiguration, Jesus transformed from human to divine and back to human. The disciples that witnessed Jesus all in white, glowing and conversing with Moses and Elijah were awe struck – this is what they expected of the Messiah. They wanted to idolize him and keep him safe, but then God spoke from the clouds and the disciples were terrified - they knew they could not manipulate the situation to fit their liking – Jesus would have to suffer to save. When Jesus transformed back to human form, he brought comfort to his disciples and showed us all that throughout all the highs and lows of life He is with us and guiding our steps. Transfiguration is a drastic change of appearance into a more beautiful or spiritual state. Transformation refers to inner changes through experience – it takes time and effort. The disciples were transfigured to transform hearts and change the world. How will we at BCUMC be transfigured to bring transformation to hearts and spirits in our community and beyond?

How are we doing?

We've received messages that we need to have more of a presence in the community. How can we do that? Maybe brochures or cards offering information about BCUMC, free advertising in local papers, banners advertising upcoming events, involvement in community events. Please continue to let us know how we are doing and think about how you can help us transform hearts and minds.

Dave Funk and I are meeting monthly with Pastor to discuss and plan ways to come together and ways to reach out. **We need your help.** Please let us know how we are doing. Look for a little black box in the sanctuary – it's a locked box that Dave and I will access regularly. You can confidentially leave messages or prayer requests – whatever you want us to know. We're hoping that you will let us know your hopes and dreams for BCUMC. Also, let us know what you like or don't like (sermons are too short or too long, more music, less music, study ideas, small group ideas, fellowship ideas, etc...) Your input will inform our actions and we want to make sure we are accurately reflecting the wants and needs of our congregation.

2023 Lenten Bible Challenge



Lent is a season of 40 days, not counting Sundays, which begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday. In Christian tradition, people abstain from entertainment, sensual pleasures and worldly desires during Lent. Many Christians use this time to prepare their body, mind, and spirit to be baptized on Easter. We want to spend this Lenten journey with **Paul's Letter to Romans** (16 chapters) and **Gospel according to Luke** (24 chapters). We will have 40 chapters to read each day of Lent. You will also be given 3 questions each day to meditate on the given chapter. You are invited to write your thoughts on the given paper.

Here are guidelines:

1. Each Sunday a weekly schedule (a chapter and three questions for the day) will be available with Sunday Bulletin (*This will be also available through Friday Email)
2. Each day, read the chapter of the day, and write your answers to three questions on the weekly schedule (this will be your weekly journal). There is no right or wrong answer. You can also write any questions on the journal instead of answers.
3. You have three choices regarding what to do with your journal as below:
 - a. You may keep your journey to yourself
 - b. You may bring your weekly journal to church and put it in a designated box in the Narthex (This will be read by the pastor and some will be shared with the congregation through zoom meetings or pastor's messages).
 - c. You may join a **zoom meeting** on the following days to share your thoughts and journey with others. If you want to join in this zoom meeting, let pastor Lee know (hslee3@gmail.com)
 - i. March 5 (Sunday) 7:00 pm to 8:00 pm
 - ii. March 19 (Sunday) 7:00 pm to 8:00 pm
 - iii. April 2 (Sunday) 7:00 pm to 8:00 pm
4. You may do this together with your loved ones at home. This can be your Lenten **Family Journey!**

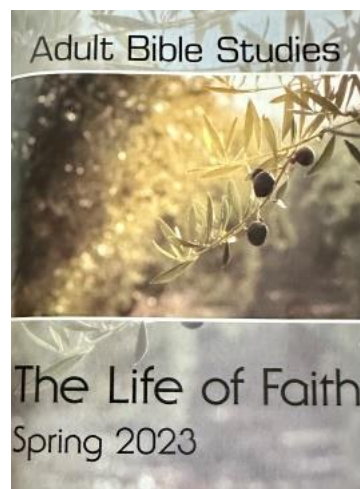
