† Pastor's Letter †

Dear Family of God,


In May, we have last two Sundays of Easter followed by Ascension Sunday and Pentecost. We may be easily discouraged and depressed whenever we watch TV news and hear about some natural and human disasters. But we are Easter People who have faith, believing Hope beyond destruction and Life beyond death. Faith shines best when it shouts out of the tomb. Faith of Jesus moved the hearts of his disciples. And we too belong to his community of Easter faith.

Life beyond death, Hope beyond destruction, all these we have witnessed in the lives of Jesus' disciples. St. Paul's ship was wrecked hopelessly. There were more than 276 people on the boat. But they all survived and safely arrived at the beach, because they all leaned on "planks" and "pieces of the ship" (Act 27:44). To me, those "planks" and "pieces of the ship" look like small groups that we as a church try to grow in number as well as in their spirituality. What I mean by "small group" is not just Bible Study Group, even though it could be the strongest one among all small groups. But **Small Group can also be any faith-based-group of people who share their mission or tasks.** In this sense, our church committees can be Small Groups. When we lean on "planks" and "pieces of the ship" in time of storm, shipwreck, or any other crisis, we can go through those times together safely. Here are small groups in Brentwood Community UMC:

Lay Leader News

April was special at BCUMC. We started with Palm Sunday and Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem. We waved our palm branches and sang Hosanna, and we learned that Jesus never gives up – not then and not now – He was and is there for us! Next, we left behind the joy of Palm Sunday and entered Holy Week – a somber time to remember the last week of Christ's life on earth. I attended the very moving Good Friday Tenebrae service, and I could only imagine how the disciples felt watching Jesus die and thinking THIS. IS. THE. END. We know the rest of the story, but it must have been horrible for the disciples and believers at that time. How could they possibly imagine what Easter would bring! Easter requires that we see beyond what is expected. THE TOMB WAS EMPTY! How could that be? Was Jesus' body stolen? Why? The truth – Christ was raised from the dead; the linens were set aside, and Jesus took his new heavenly form. As I said, we know what came next, but it must have been something for those that met the risen Christ and believed. Jesus' resurrection requires us to see beyond what appears and instead use our hearts to see how the Holy Spirit can work in and through us. Jesus' death was NOT the end for Him or for us. His life, his death, his resurrection gives us hope for the future. Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again!

After Easter, our Pastor took a well-earned vacation, and we had the pleasure of receiving a message from our friend, Dr. Hugh Stevenson. His message was entitled, "What a Mess!" During the Children's time, Dr. Stevenson shared the book, There is No Such Thing as a Dragon, a story of a little boy who awakes to find a dragon in his room. When he shares this news with his Mother, she says there is no such thing as a dragon. But the little boy continues to see the dragon and with each rebuff from his Mother the dragon grows. Only when the dragon grows so big that he can't be ignored does the Mother admit that dragons can be real. The moral of the story – ignoring your problems only tends to make them grow into a big mess. In his message, Dr. Stevenson shared that before God stepped in at creation everything was a mess – absolute chaos. God assigned everything a place and a purpose. There was chaos again at Jesus'; crucifixion, but again God was in control – Jesus was raised from the dead. We all experience dragons/chaos of some sort in our lives – health issues, financial issues, political turmoil, personal problems, wars, violence, etc... In this chaos we must remember that God never leaves us. Jesus rose from the dead – chaos is conquered – it no longer has power over us. God does not leave us; he sends his Holy Spirit to be with us and cares for us always and forever!

On April 23, our Youth lead our service, and from what I saw, we have some amazing young people in our midst. What a blessing – what a gift! Rachael Green, a high school junior gave the message, "The Sound of Silence". She reminded us that we live in a fast-paced world – lots of multitasking and way too many tabs open. I'm guilty of this for sure. We all long for contentment for peace. We long for the Sound of Silence which only comes when we slow down enough to hear God and allow Him to speak to us. Jesus opened himself to God – He said not my will but yours, God. That's some kind of trust! Are we willing to set aside our agendas and trust God to lead us? Let's all take time to be still and silent and open to where God is leading us. Thank you, Rachael, for sharing; your faith is admirable!

As we move from Winter into Spring may we take the time to appreciate the wonders of God's creation and hear Him speak to our souls. God bless you all!

How are we doing?

Dave Funk and I are meeting monthly with Pastor to discuss and plan ways to come together and ways to reach out. **We need your help.** Please let us know how we are doing. Look for a little black box in the sanctuary – it's a locked box that Dave and I will access regularly. You can confidentially leave messages or prayer requests – whatever you want us to know. We're hoping that you will let us know your hopes and dreams for BCUMC. Also, let us know what you like or don't like (sermons are too short or too long, more

music, less music, study ideas, small group ideas, fellowship ideas, etc...) Your input will inform our actions and we want to make sure we are accurately reflecting the wants and needs of our congregation. We are acting on the feedback we are receiving, and things are happening! We've received positive input on how happy and friendly our congregation is. Also, praise for how joyfully Pastor interacts with the children each Sunday and still shares the sermon topic with the kids. Someone also mentioned how much they like seeing the choir in their beautiful robes and wish they'd wear them every Sunday. This request was passed on to our Choir Director, Alivia, and Dave Funk, as a member of the choir, shared that the choir robes can be quite warm and uncomfortable to wear during the hottest months of the year, making singing a less joyful experience. Usually, when the choir is not wearing their robes, they are dressed in a coordinated fashion in keeping with the colors of the Church calendar or for a special event. We are continuing to look at ways to increase our presence in the community, and we ask you to please think about who we are as a Church and how we can work together to help transform hearts and minds and spread the good news of Jesus and bring glory to God.

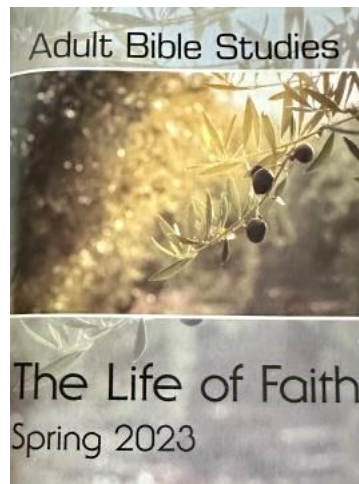
