Dear Friends in God's Family

Remember Jesus used five loaves of bread and two fish to feed more than 20,000 people in the wilderness! May God bless our small acts of faith today and all other days!

Fourthly, <u>let us remember God's call</u> in such a time like this, call to represent God's kin-dom, its values and visions. I'd like to invite you to ask yourself and meditate on the following questions:

- Do I have HATE against anyone or any group? Why?
- Do I have HYPOCRISY? What desires do I hide deep down?
- Am I trying to ENTRAP anybody? For what?

Then, let's meditate on the following questions:

- Am I giving to God what belongs to God? What is God's?
- Am I finding my heart in humility, purity and kindness?
- Am I suffering for the sake of what Jesus stand for?

May your family and people in your life be blessed by you always!




