


#### Dear Beloved in Christ

HAPPY EASTER! The Risen Lord is with us! He came back for us so we can have a resurrection life too – a life with the Risen Lord, with His strength and with extra Hope in Him. We are not alone in any circumstance. Thanks be to God!

I hope and pray that our United Methodist Church can find a new hope for the future. 2024 General Conference of U.M.C. is about to begin. General Conference is the only body that can set official policy and speak for the international denomination. It brings together lay and clergy delegates from four continents whose decisions will affect how millions of United Methodists do church for years to come.

From April 23 to May 3, United Methodists from around the world will gather in Charlotte, North Carolina for General Conference. The theme comes from Psalm 46:9-10a: "He makes wars cease to the end of the earth; he breaks the bow and shatters the spear; he burns the shields with fire.

#### Be still and know that I am God!"



General Conference is expected to attract between 5,500-7,500 people. That includes 862 voting delegates—55.9% from the U.S., 32% from Africa, 6% from the Philippines, 4.6% from Europe, and the remainder from concordat churches that have close ties to The United Methodist Church.

A group of delegates (about 300) who are concerned about the inclusivity of UMC has publicized an appeal letter on March 28<sup>th</sup>, 2024. They propose 3 Rs to happen during this General Conference as follows:

**R**egionalization: We support ... to create distinct regional governing bodies in Africa, Europe, the Philippines, and the U.S. These proposed changes would expand the ability of regions outside the U.S. to adapt portions of the UM Book of

Discipline, and, for the first time, would give the U.S. the same authority. We support this legislation because we are committed to greater self-determination and self-governance. We also believe that expanding regional decision-making will allow annual conferences within each region to thrive.

**Revise Social Principles:** We support the adoption of the revised Social Principles as a much-needed restatement of our fundamental moral and social commitments as United Methodists... the newly revised Social Principles fulfill their mandates to be more globally relevant, theologically, and biblically grounded, and succinct. The revised Social Principles provide a timely opportunity for reaffirming who we are as United Methodists.

**R**emoval of Exclusionary Policies: We support the removal of all provisions in the UM Book of Discipline regarding the participation of gays and lesbians in The United Methodist Church. Added more than fifty years ago to address issues primarily affecting the U.S. Church, the current prohibitions have led to years of disagreement, conflict, and harm to those they have impacted. Removing the current language will create a new starting place for dialogue and learning. It will also remove a significant stumbling block to engaging all people in the ministries of the Church, particularly for local congregations and annual conferences ready to welcome LGBTQ+ people as full church members.

It looks like the special session will be live-streamed. I'd like to ask all of you to pray for our denomination that we may continue to bless one another no matter what happens this year and that we may become more like Christ through all the work and conversation we have.

"Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, and give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you!" (1 Thessalonians 5:16-18)

## **Easter Breakfast**



## BCUMC ADULT BIBLE STUDY FOR THE 2024 SPRING TRIMESTER

Our Adult Bible Study series continues this Spring 2024 with the theme "Encounters in Prayer and Love".



We announce Jesus' Resurrection with Easter lilies, the sound of trumpets, and bright streaming light. After all, it is Christianity most significant event. Without Resurrection there is no Christian faith.

But Resurrection happened in a cave, it happened in complete silence, in absolute darkness .... New life starts in the dark. Whether it is a seed in the ground, a baby in the womb, or Jesus in the tomb, it starts in the dark. But, rather than a hopeless and void meaning, the darkness of Lent and Holy Week creates fertile ground for us, for it invites us more deeply into prayer and that, in turn, leads us into God's presence.

Our lessons continue with the theme of prayer begun last quarter and allow us to listen in as Jesus, fully aware of what awaited him, prayed. He prayed for his disciples, for their safety and unity. He prayed for us, "for those who believe in [him] because of their word" (John 17:20). He prayed for himself. He prayed that God's will would be done. As Jesus prayed, so can we. And when we do, we find new life in him. With that new life comes the indwelling Spirit of God, who empowers us to engage in our world in ways that announce the good news and work for justice, peace, reconciliation, and healing. The work of this empowering Spirit forms the foundation for the remaining lessons of our Adult Bible study series this quarter.

"I am the light of the world," Jesus said. "Whoever follows me won't walk in darkness but will have the light of life" (John 8:12).


Even though I will miss EVERYONE, I am excited about this new challenge and I'm looking forward to starting a new phase of my career.

## BCUMC Food Policy Update By Heidi Stark

Last month, I shared that in February, the Ad. Council had been asked to reevaluate our current food policy and lift the ban on homemade items. We did not take a vote at the February meeting; instead, we agreed to ask the congregation and specifically the ten victims of the November food poisoning to give their thoughts and opinions on lifting the ban on homemade items. I personally reached out to the ten people affected in November and their responses were the only input received. At our March Ad. Council meeting, I shared that nine out of the ten people who suffered from the food poisoning in November, were fine with lifting the ban, but one member felt that this was happening too soon. I shared with the Ad. Council my discussion with that member who understands the desire to change the policy but questions the timing. The member also acknowledged that the trauma the member experienced may not be lessened with time. While all the victims believe that the incident was unintentional and unlikely to happen in the future, it did happen, and we need to be respectful of everyone's feelings. I shared with Ad. Council that my gut reaction in February was that it was too soon to make a change to our policy, but as we discussed at our meeting what would be proper timing. 6 months, 9 months, a year? After some discussion, it was suggested that a new food policy be drafted (see below) to go into effect June 1, 2024, if approved by Ad. Council vote. This amended policy would allow for homemade items, but also always offers a commercially prepared and individually packaged food option at fellowship events. Our goal is always to make BCUMC a safe and hospitable place for everyone. Please let us know your thoughts on this proposed change. You may leave feedback in the suggestion box at the back of the sanctuary or contact Pastor Lee, or Lay Leader, Dave Funk or Ad. Council Chair/Lay Leader, Heidi Stark. We will vote on this matter at the April Ad. Council meeting; so, please reach out prior to April 17. We look forward to hearing from you.

### PROPOSED BCUMC FOOD POLICY

As of June 1, 2024, the Administrative Council is proposing an amendment to our current food policy for Church social events. We will no longer ban homemade items at fellowship gatherings. However, BCUMC will also offer a commercially prepared, individually packaged food item or food items to respect all members and friends of BCUMC. We appreciate everyone's support as we try to provide a healthy and safe environment for all to worship and fellowship in.
