Plan to join us for potatoes, fun, and fellowship.

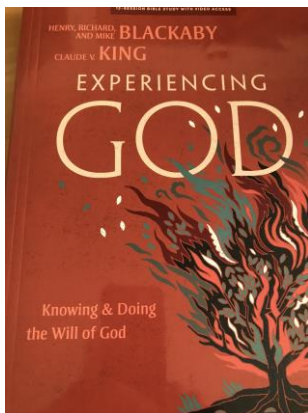

#### **How are we doing?**

As Lay Leaders, Dave Funk and I are meeting monthly with Pastor to discuss and plan ways to come together and ways to reach out. We need your help. Please let us know how we are doing. Look for a little black box in the sanctuary – it’s a locked box that Dave and I will access regularly. You can confidentially leave messages or prayer requests – whatever you want us to know. We’re hoping that you will let us know your hopes and dreams for BCUMC. Also, let us know what you like or don’t like. Your input will inform our actions and we want to make sure we are accurately reflecting the wants and needs of our congregation.

## Results of Adult Small Group Survey

In July Pastor and your Lay Leaders provided a survey form to determine interest in small group programs. We continue to look for ways to foster spiritual growth and build strong relationships within our community, and we encourage everyone to consider participating in a Small Group over the next year.

We received 24 survey responses. The majority of the responses came from the 66-80 age range. Most respondents were not currently part of a small group; so, we are excited to see how we can put these results into action and get everyone involved in a small group. If you have an idea or an interest in organizing an event, please let Pastor, Dave Funk or Heidi Stark know. Here's what we learned:

- Most respondents indicated an interest in having activity or fellowship groups; so, we are looking into ideas for organizing dinner groups, progressive dinners, hiking groups, etc... If you have an idea or an interest in organizing such an event, please let Pastor, Dave Funk or Heidi Stark know.
- Bible study was another top interest; so, we will continue to offer Bible study options throughout the year.
- Women's and Men's groups also scored high. United Women in Faith meetings are typically held at 7pm on the third Monday of the month in the Fellowship Hall, and United Methodist Men have their meeting and breakfast in the Fellowship Hall on the first Saturday of the month.
- Most respondents preferred monthly in person meetings in the evenings.

On Sunday, August 25<sup>th</sup> 20 friends gathered in the Fellowship Hall for a potluck dinner and talent show. In true United Methodist fashion, we had lots of amazing and tasty potluck dishes. # What's in it for ME? - Part 3

Here's one more:

Researchers studying this phenomenon found that observers who witnessed another person's generosity were more likely to behave generously toward a third person. In fact, the cycles of generosity started by one person frequently repeated three times, from person to person to person to person. In other words, your generosity can set off a ripple effect that has a much wider impact in your community and the world. Pretty cool, right? God surely thinks so! I'm certain that this is all part of His beautiful plan.

God, of course, is the most generous giver of all, as everything we enjoy, cherish, love comes from Him. By receiving His love and generosity and paying it forward, surely, we will all come to thrive!
