

BISHOP CARCAÑO'S BIO

Bishop Minerva G. Carcaño is a native of Edinburg, Texas. A third generation Methodist she experienced the call to ordained ministry as a child though at that moment in her life she only knew that she felt called to live in the church. The church has been her home throughout her life. She has served as pastor in communities in Texas, California and New Mexico.

Bishop Carcaño has served as a district superintendent in the West Texas and New Mexico area as well as in the greater Portland, Oregon area. She was the founding pastor of the ecumenical ministry, the South Albuquerque Cooperative Ministry, in Albuquerque, New Mexico, which was recognized by the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church U.S.A. as its outstanding ecumenical project in 1998. She has also directed the Mexican American Program, the Spanish language Course of Study School, and the Hispanic Studies Program of Perkins School of Theology. She was elected to the Episcopacy of The UMC in 2004 and served as bishop of the Phoenix Area, the Desert Southwest Conference, from 2004 to 2012. In 2012 she was assigned to the Los Angeles Area, the California-Pacific Conference. In 2016, she was assigned to the San Francisco Area, the California-Nevada Conference.

Bishop Carcaño is a graduate of the University of Texas at Pan American and Perkins School of Theology of Southern Methodist University. Both schools have honored her with their highest alumni recognitions. She is married to Thomas L. Spaniolo, a lawyer who specializes in immigration and criminal law. They have a daughter, Sofia T. Spaniolo-Carcaño, who resides in Chicago, Illinois.



Video Project Update

The Video Project Committee met several months ago and agreed on a plan that would, over time as donations are made, allow us to install a video projection system in the Sanctuary

and the Social Hall. The completed project will have two projectors and screens in the front of the Sanctuary. There will be a third projector and screen on the back wall of the Sanctuary so the choir and the pastor can see what is being projected. The Social Hall will have one projector and screen.

All of the projectors will be able to be controlled from the back of the Sanctuary. Over \$9,000 has been donated for the project and we have ordered equipment for the first part of the project. The next step is to hire an electrician and have electrical outlets installed for the projectors and screens. Once the electrical work is done we can have a contractor install the equipment.



While we are waiting for the electrical and contractor quotes, we can use the new equipment by simply putting the new projectors on stands and use our old portable screens like we have been doing.

We don't have price estimates yet for the electrical and contractor work, but we think we have the money to install the projectors and screens in the front of the church. We do not have enough money for permanent cabling for the projectors. Instead, we will install temporary cables so we can use the projectors.

If things go well, the new projectors, screens and temporary cables should be in place by late August or early September.

Donations for the Video Project are always welcome and will allow us to finish the project more quickly. We will need about \$6,500 for the next phase of the project: the third projector and screen at the back of the church for the choir and pastor, permanent cabling for all three projectors and a controller for the projectors.


