



# **The Covenant Bible Study**

- The biblical concept of *covenant* is used as a unifying pattern all through the books in O.T. and N.T.

#### [After the first 7 weeks of Creating the Covenant]

I was in the Creating the Covenant class that just completed the first book. The book was easy to read. The video helped explain the book well. The discussion was lovely. I learned a lot about the Bible and my own faith journey. I am looking forward to the next section. See Pastor Lee to join us! By Vickey Barriner

The study this quarter is about God creating a covenant with the Hebrew people, and the journey they had together. He sets up rules to guide them in living their lives- to enable them to live in peace with themselves and their neighbors. They obey for a while, rebel against the rules, are punished by God. They repent, God forgives them, they live in peace---and the cycle starts over again.

What we learn from this is that it can be the story of our lives, and our nation's life, and indeed, the story of all humankind. The OT presents this in stark terms.

As we continue on with this study we will eventually work our way up to the NT where Jesus presents a clearer picture of God as a loving Father, and gives us the gift of the Holy Spirit to guide us through the ups and downs of life, and all the temptations that come to make us drift away from God.

God's chosen people learned that consequences came swift and sure when they rebelled and drifted away from God. It's a lesson not too late to be learning today!
