

Dear Members and Friends of B.C.U.M.C.

I hope and pray that you are all doing well in this *hot hot hot summer* season! We will start very HOT stuff in August! It is for our spiritual growth and meaningful fellowship with one another! The New Team (Creative Intentional Spiritual Formation) has worked hard to create this intentional spiritual journey since January this year.

I am so pleased and excited to introduce you to **SUNDAY NIGHT LIVE** (look for more information on another page of this Newsletter)! It is a three hour event (5pm-8pm) where people gather together for (1) Bread & Soup; (2) Music & Devotion; and (3) Small Group experience. However, this is <u>not</u> a one-time-event! On the very first Sunday Night Live (**5 pm Sunday August 7**), people will be invited to choose one of the four small groups: (1) for High School youth <Dare to Dream: Creating a God-sized Mission Statement>, led by Jen Dunn and Michele Monsef for 6 weeks; for adults (2) <A Parenting Class, led by Julius Lukacs for 4 weeks; (3) <Deliver Me from Negative Self Talk>, led by Charlene Dobson; and (4) <The Book of Ruth: Community of Love>, led by Rev. Sungho Lee (Concord United Methodist Church), husband of Pastor Hyesung Lee, for 4 weeks. Each of these 4 classes will choose their own schedule among the participants. All of them will end within 4 or 6 or more weeks. Then, we will have the second **SUNDAY NIGHT LIVE** on October 2nd to which old and new participants will be invited and given a chance to choose one among another set of multiple small groups. And the 3rd **SUNDAY NIGHT LIVE** will be held in February 2017. I am so confident that **SUNDAY NIGHT LIVE** will bring us all together. We will get to know one another better and grow together. Please make your schedule available for this journey together!

During 2016 Cal-Nev Annual Conference of United Methodist Church (June 22-25), a significant thing happened. Among 10 candidates for ordination as Elders in full connection, three had signed #CalledOut Statement (Coming-out as LGBTQE) at the 2016 General Conference in Portland in May. In addition to our 3 candidates, there were more than 100 pastors and candidates who signed the same statement during General Conference. Their names were publicized throughout General Conference News agencies.

So, within our Conference, before our Annual Conference started, some clergy members had raised a complaint against these 3 candidates for ordination and appealed the Board of Ordained Ministry and the Bishop to rule out their eligibility for ordination. This was not a legal act but done through personal emails to the concerned board. During Clergy Session last week at the Annual Conference, an attempt to deny their eligibility for ordination was made by some clergy members. But all 10 candidates had a chance to present themselves for 3 minutes – some by video presentations, others by speeches. Those 3 gay candidates presented themselves through genuine, personal and excellent speeches, recommendations by their parishioners, co-workers, colleagues, DS, and Board of Ordained Ministry members were unanimously positive, based on their 2 years of actual ministries in local churches. They showed undeniable God-given gifts and grace. They were ultimately accepted with joyful applause by the absolute majority of the body. Their ordinations were celebrated with the whole body of Annual Conference through the Ordination Celebration Service on Friday.

This was the first time for our Cal Nev Annual Conference to have ever ordained openly gay candidates. And we became the second Annual Conference following New York Annual Conference that had taken such an act. This change is significant not only to the church but also to all the families whose members belong to LGBTQE community. I hope we, the church, continue to open our doors to ALL people with the unconditional love of God.

May you be filled with the refreshing power of the Holy Spirit today and every day!


The VOYAGERS ...






