VOLUNTEERS NEEDED AT BCUMC

The TRUSTEES have many projects that could use your help. Our primary focus is to deep clean and spruce up the church in preparation for the 150th Anniversary Celebration in September.

Our biggest task involves recruiting **teams** to work in each room of the church and around the building to deep clean it. This will involve scrubbing, degreasing, wiping down fixtures, etc. We are looking to recruit around 6 or 7 teams of 2-5 people to be available on a few weekends in July. The Trustees will provide cleaning supplies and equipment, but we need **volunteers** to use them.

A **team** formed by the Girl Scout group has volunteered to take on the Sunday School room and an anonymous team will clean on men's and women's bathrooms located in the lower level.

OTHER TRUSTEE PROJECTS

THAT HAVE BEEN COMPLETED OR ARE IN THE WORKS INCLUDE:

A large project was completed recently – the removal of the garden shed debris, H.O.P.E. House "donations" and other unwanted items around the property. Trustees would like to give a special thanks to Jerry Walton, Chuck Nixon, Blake Kurz and Debra, Rick & Vince Urzua for loading up their trucks multiple times and disposing of the debris over the first 3 Saturdays in May. We would also like to thank all those who volunteered their City of Brentwood bill in order for us to have the privilege of their dump appointment.

A contractor has been found who will repair the H.O.P.E. House retaining wall. Trustees have signed a contract for the work, but a start date has not yet been set.

The back fence at the Parsonage suffered damage during the recent heavy winds. The amount of material has been estimated and volunteers have been recruited.

An additional sidewalk was constructed at the Love for Learning Preschool and plans are in the works to provide additional parking for their workers and parents.

The Trustees selected the "loop" style of assisted listening devices to be used in the Sanctuary. This is the system that will work with hearing aids equipped with T-Coil technology. Some individual receivers will also be purchased for those people who do not have hearing aids with T-Coils. Trustees are presently gathering pricing information.

TOUR OF BENICIA!!

The *Book of Joy* discussion group is scheduling a trip to Benicia on Saturday June 24. We invite anyone from the congregation so inclined to join us. Benicia is a very important historic site in Early California History. It was the third capitol of California from 1853-1854. The Constitution for the State of California was written in Monterey in 1849. The first state capitol was in San Jose, 1849-51, the second capitol was in Vallejo,1852-53, the third capitol was in Benicia, 1853-54, then Sacramento from 1854 to the present. The only original building that was used as the capitol of California is the one in Benicia. It is now the Benicia Capitol State Historic Park, maintained and staffed by the California State Parks. We would love anyone who is interested to join us. The agenda for the trip is:

Tour Saint Paul's Episcopal Church. The church was built in 1859. Work on the church was done by Scandinavian Shipwrights. Their nautical heritage is reflected in the ceiling, which resembles an inverted ship's hull and is similar in design to Norwegian stave churches. California redwood with wooden dowels was used in the church's construction. The church has a floor plan of a cross. I hope to get someone from the church to give us a tour. They usually are pleased to accommodate a request.

Tour Benicia Capitol State Historic Park. When the capitol of California was moved to Sacramento, the building was used by the City of Benicia for many purposes. It was used as a city hall, a firehouse, a jail, a school. In 1951, the State Legislature enacted a bill accepting the building from the City of Benicia and restoring it to its original appearance. The State Department of Architecture spent six years of research and restoration to restore the building to the way it was when it was the capitol of California.

Tour the Fisher Hanlon House. The house is adjacent to the Capitol building. During the Gold Rush, it was a boarding house on First Street. Joseph Fisher, a butcher, bought the building in 1858 and moved it to its present location. Three generations of the family lived in the residence until 1966 when the granddaughters of the Fishers donated it to the state, making it part of the Benicia Capitol State Historic Park.

Have lunch at Captain Blythers Restaurant on first street in Benicia.
