ORDINANCE NO. 84-1

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF WOODLOCH, TEXAS; PROVIDING FOR THE OFFICE OF JUDGE OF THE MUNICIPAL COURT TO BE FILLED BY APPOINTMENT; PROVIDING THAT SUCH APPOINTMENT SHALL BE MADE BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF WOODLOCH, TEXAS; PROVIDING A REPEALING CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMAN OF THE TOWN OF WOODLOCH, TEXAS:

SECTION I.

The office of the Municipal Judge of the Town of Woodloch, Texas shall henceforth be filled by appointment and such appointment shall be made by the Town Council. The Town Council shall determine the qualifications for and the compensation of the Judge of the Municipal Court.

SECTION II.

This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon passage. The term of office of the first Municipal Judge appointed under authority of this Ordinance shall expire on April 1, 1985.

SECTION III.

All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are expressly repealed.

SECTION IV.

The importance of this Ordinance and its intent and purpose being declared to be for the benefit of the citizens and property owners in the Town of Woodloch, Texas, constitute an emergency, and an imperative public necessity that it be declared to be an emergency measure and that this Ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage and it is so enacted.
