

Motion was made by Lloyd Shenberger, seconded by Rozy Shocklee, that the following Ordinance be passed:

NO. 45

AN ORDINANCE SUSPENDING THE PROPOSED RATE INCREASE BY GULF STATES UTILITIES COMPANY OF THE RATES FOR ELECTRIC UTILITY SERVICES IN THE CITY OF WOODLOCH, TEXAS; PROVIDING THE REASONS THEREFOR; AND PROVIDING THE EFFECTIVE DATE HEREOF.

WHEREAS, on May 1, 1981, Gulf States Utilities Company filed with the City its Statement of Intent to increase its rates for electric utility service in the City of Woodloch, Texas, effective June 5, 1981; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that Gulf States Utilities Company's proposed increase in its rates for electric utility service in the City should be suspended to a future date, to-wit: to a time 120 days after the proposed effective date of June 5, 1981, for the following reasons:

(1) The City Council has not had sufficient time to analyze and study the proposed increase;

(2) That in order to reach a determination of the justness, reasonableness, and propriety of such rate increase, it will be necessary to employ rate experts to investigate and analyze such proposed rates:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WOODLOCH, TEXAS:

Section 1. That the proposed increase by Gulf States Utilities Company of its rates for electric service in the City be, and is hereby, suspended for a period of 120 days after the proposed effective date of June 5, 1981.

Section 2. This being an Ordinance not requiring publication it shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
