

ORDINANCE NO. 2001-01

AN ORDINANCE CANCELING THE MAY 5, 2001, GENERAL ELECTION AND DECLARING EACH UNOPPOSED CANDIDATE ELECTED TO OFFICE; PROVIDING THAT THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BE CUMULATIVE OF ALL ORDINANCES; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Town of Woodloch, Texas is a municipal corporation duly organized and existing under the general laws of the State of Texas;

WHEREAS, in accordance with the law of general election has been ordered for May 5, 2001 for the purpose of electing council members to serve on the Town council of the Town of Woodloch, Texas; and

WHEREAS, no proposition is to appear on the ballot in that election; and

WHEREAS, the Town Secretary has certified in writing that each candidate on the ballot is unopposed for election to office; and

WHEREAS, the filing deadlines for placement on the ballot and declaration or write-in candidacy has passed; and

WHEREAS, in these circumstances, Subchapter C of Chapter 2 of the Election Code authorizes a governing body to declare each unopposed candidate elected to office and cancel the election.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF WOODLOCH, TEXAS, THAT:

SECTION I

The following candidates, who are unopposed in the May 5, 2001 General Election, are hereby declared elected to office after the expiration of the respective, current terms and shall be issued a certificate of election:

Position 1: James Lout

Position 2: Lorraine Mack

Position 3: John Linnehan

SECTION II

The Town Secretary is directed to post a copy of this ordinance at each designated polling place on May 5, 2001.

SECTION III

This ordinance shall be cumulative of all provisions of ordinances of the Town of Woodloch, Texas, except where the provisions of this ordinance are in direct conflict with the provisions if such ordinances are hereby repealed.


SECTION IV

It is hereby declared to be the intention of the Town Council that the phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, and sections of this ordinance are severable, and if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section of this ordinance shall be declared unconstitutional by the valid judgment or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs and sections of this ordinance, since the same would have been enacted by the Town Council without the incorporation in this ordinance of any such unconstitutional phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section.


SECTION V
