 - Pray for the children

 - Leaders working as a team (jobs for each leader)
- 4. Vibrant Lessons
 - Yearly plan
 - Visuals (no object lessons they don't understand symbolism until 3rd grade)
 - Exciting delivery teach, bring home a truth that sticks
 - Quiet seat award
- 5. Inspiring Motivation
 - Teach HOW to memorize
 - Helps for learning books of the Bible (CD, songs, memory tricks, mneumonics)
 - Handbook CD (encourage use of this)
 - Clip chart
 - Marble jar
- 6. Energetic Games
 - FUN, but not too intense
 - Not too complicated
 - Appropriate for young kids
 - o Begin with simple games because of children moving up from Cubbies
 - Kids are not as finely tuned in motor skills yet as 3-6th graders
 - Leaders helping on the line
 - o Don't try to run game time with only a game director
 - 2 leaders on every line. One at the beginning to help explain the rules; one at the end to encourage and cheer and high five the child who just finished
 - Every child participating

- Be sensitive to new Kindergarten clubbers. Give a couple weeks to watch if they ask for it.
- Firmly but kindly tell a timid child, I'm going with you this time here we go!
- o If children are allowed to sit out of games indefinitely, you'll have an epidemic of kids not wanting to play, resulting in discipline problems.

7. Awesome Awards Time

- Make it a special recognition
 - o Child's name is called; stand or come forward, or walk down a red carpet
- Cheers, high 5's
- Sparky suitcase (pick a trinket when book is completed before the end of year Awards Night)
- Best way to award jewels
 - o Each leader has jewels in leader notebook. Give jewel when earned.
 - o Announce child's name and give recognition of jewel at Awards Time
- Celebrate birthdays
- Cookie bucket (send home with different child each week; instructions of how many cookies to bring, and no peanuts or tree nuts)
- Parents picking up children at end of Awards Time
- 8. Productive Handbook Time
 - Consider it your ministry
 - Leader notebook
 - Keep records as you go
 - Rotate after 5 minutes or 2 sections
 - Use every second of time / teach a new section / teach the meaning
 - Keep good discipline
