Prayer

Why Should we pray:

- 1) Christ was constantly dependent upon it (Mt 14:23; 26:36,39; Mr 1:35; Lu 9:18,29.) In the gospels there are 17 references to Jesus at prayer.
- 2) God commands it and is pleased by it. (1Thes.5:17; Prov.15:8)
- 3) Prayer protects us from our enemy who is great and our flesh who is weak (Mk.14:38; Luke 22:31-32)
- 4) Prayer gives us peace from anxiety (Phil.4:6-7).
- 5) Prayer is the means that God has appointed for receiving mercy, and obtaining grace to help in time of need (Heb.4:16).
- 6) Prayer brings guidance and wisdom (Col.1:9; James 1:5).
- 7) God will answer (Isa.65:24)
- 8) God will heal us (Job 42:10)
- 9) Your joy will be made full (Jn.16:24)
- 10) Provides laborers for God's work (Matt.9:38).

Types of Prayer:

Adoration/Praise-Worshipping God for who He is (The Psalms, Rom. 11:33).

Thanksgiving- Thanking God for what He has done (Ps.107:8; Phil.4:6)

Confession- Praying for our forgiveness (1 John 1:9).

Intercessory- Praying for others especially for their spiritual well being (Eph.1:18-19; Eph.3:14-19; Exod.32:11-14).

Supplication- A plea to God for something we need. (James 4:2).

Different Answers to Prayer

- 1) Sometimes immediately. (Da 9:21,23; 10:12)
- 2) Sometimes after delay. (Lu 18:1-7)
- 3) Sometimes the answer is "no" or different than our desires. (Exod.32:30-35; 2Co 12:8,9.
- 4) Beyond expectation. Eph 3:20.

Principles of Prayer

- 1) Be persistent (Luke 11:8-9; 18:1-7)
- 2) Pray with expectancy (Mark 11:24)
- 3) With confidence and faith in God. (1Jo 5:14-15; Lu 11:9,10; Joh 14:13,14.)
- 4) According to the will of God (1Jo 5:14-15)
- 5) With submission to God. Lu 22:42.
- 6) With boldness. Heb 4:16.
- 7) In holiness and a cleansed heart (Heb.10:22)
- 8) With earnestness (James 5:16-17)

Model of Prayer (Matt.6:9-15) (c.f. John 17)

Statement: Make God the center of your prayers and God will make you the center of His answers.

God's glory (V.9-10)

- 1) God's priority-"Hallowed be Thy name."
- 2) God's program-"Thy kingdom come"
- 3) God's plan-"Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven"

Man's need (11-13a)

- 4) God's provisions-"Give us this day our daily bread."
- 5) God's pardon-"Forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors."
- 6) God's protection-"Do not lead us into temptation, but deliver us from evil."

Practical principles of a prayer life

- 1) Have a time (Dan.6:10; Mark 1:35; Ps. 57:2,8).
- 2) Have a place (Matt.6:6)
- 3)' Talk to the Lord throughout the whole day.
- 4) Record your requests and God's answers.
- 5) Pray with your family.
- 6) Have soft music in the background to keep your mind from wondering and to create an atmosphere of worship.
- 7) Turn off the radio in the car and pray while you drive.
