

SERMON: IT'S ALL ABOUT THE BLOOD

1st Peter 1:18-19

(18) Forasmuch as ye know that ye were not redeemed with corruptible things, as silver and gold, from your vain conversation received by tradition from your fathers; (19) But with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot.

Introduction

The theme of the Bible is the blood of Jesus. The blood of Jesus is seen as a scarlet thread that runs from Genesis to Revelation. If it were possible to remove the blood, what would we have? We would have a Bible without a heart, a gospel without saving power, and a message that is hopeless. The Bible magnifies the blood. Peter calls it "precious" blood.

Exposition

1. The Blood Is The Price Of Our Redemption.

(1st Corinthians 6:20; 1st Corinthians 7:23.)

2. The Blood Is The Promise Of Our Peace.

(Colossians 1:20-21.)

3. The Blood Is The Power To Overcome The Works Of Satan.

(Revelation 12:11.)

Closing Thoughts

There is no substitute for the blood. So long as God is holy and humans are sinful, there will be a need for the blood. The old preachers put it this way: "If you ever get to heaven, it will be through the blood." The hymn writer put it this way:

"God leads his dear children,
Some through the water,
Some through the flood,
Some through the fires,
But all through the blood."

Give God Glory! Give God All The Glory!
