Family Promise Update

A Family Promise update from Park's Coordinators: Linda Werts, Deb Compher, Anne Rogers, Carol Thurston...

We now know our first "rotation" date: Sunday, November 4th. Family Promise of Wayne County will open its doors to serve homeless families on Sunday, October 21st with the first "rotation" scheduled at Church of the Epiphany in Sodus. So, here at Park we will be scheduling for volunteers from 5-7pm from Sunday, November 4th through Saturday, November 10th to serve dinner, eat with our guests and help them clean up. The same folks or others will be needed to socialize, help with homework, play games, etc. between 7-9pm. We are also looking for two more volunteers to sleep over at the church, arriving about 8:30pm and leaving around 7:00am. Please speak with any one of us if you are available and have NOT already signed up.

Beginning in September you will see a few changes in programing. After careful consideration, reflection, and discernment, the Worship Team and session made the decision to move forward without an 8:00 a.m. service, and will be introducing a monthly contemporary style service in October, with the hopes of drawing in more youth and families. If you would like to be part of the worship team for these special services, please let me know. We would especially welcome input and ideas from our youth and their families for consideration.

Angela Tirado (our previous Christian Ed. director) has decided not to return this fall due to a new job and scheduling conflicts. After learning of Angela's decision not to return, the Christian Ed. team began to talk and explore the possibilities of introducing a new program. They discussed the pros and cons of continuing with our current Sunday morning program verses an ecumenical program that will potentially draw in more children. The team discussed the success of the Vacation Bible School, which was a joint venture between many churches in the neighborhood, drawing participation from several churches. The program served over thirty children. After lengthy discussions, the team and session decided to try a new program format that will take place once a month on a Sunday afternoon inviting many churches to participate. Recognizing the need for a nursery, the teams decided to continue on Sunday mornings with a nursery school option for kids of kindergarten age and under. Watch the bulletins and announcements for further details concerning both programs.

As you can see, most of the usual programs and events are in our programming line up, with a few changes and enhancements. We hope that the new changes and formats will address the worship and education needs where there may currently be gaps and needs to fill. While change can sometimes be hard, the leadership team stands beside and supports the teams of Park Church striving to meet the everchanging needs within the community. We hope that everyone remains flexible as we tweak and introduce our new programs.

Rally day is almost here! The date is set for Sunday, September 23rd. This year's Rally day will feature a mini-fair where each event or team leader will have an information table set up featuring fall opportunities (including volunteer opportunities) that are available. Bring your calendars along so you can be sure to know your availability and get signed up for some of the wonderful programs that will be offered.

There is a lot to be thankful for at Park Church and I want to thank all of you for your dedication in making the life of this church so fruitful. Be sure to thank the event planners, team leaders and session members for their hard work when you get a chance, because these programs can't happen without them. We hope you enjoy the Fall Program lineup!

What this does is that it allows you to email a large group of people without sharing everyone's email addresses. If you're not sure how this works, give me a call or stop by the office, and I will be more than happy to show you.

And if you're included in a large group mailing, please be sure you have folks' permission before you begin sending them emails for other purposes.

Property Team Updates

The team is always looking for new volunteers. Whether it's running the sound-board during worship or special events – training available! – or helping us with the various odd jobs that always seem to need our attention, we'd be glad to have you on board. Many hands do make light (er) work. And it helps us ensure the church and grounds are functioning at and looking their best.

WORK COMPLETED:

- created soundboard operating instructions.
- replaced defective wiring on overhead light bar.
- replaced 11 ea. dais overhead lights with brighter, long-life LEDs.
- repaired southwest sanctuary A/C unit. Betlem H&C.
- painting of east kitchen stairwell. THANKS, Natalie Lemmon!

PROJECTS IN THE WORKS:

- west exterior stairs. The majority of masonry work by Fenyn Masonry is completed and the next step is scraping and grinding away the many layers of built-up paint, followed by fresh coats of paint on the steps and columns by Clingerman Painting and a repair to the railing compliments of Wayne Smith. There are other masonry repairs in the planning stages: the east entryway and interior wall adjacent to men's room entrance. Let us know if you're good with a trowel.
- roof sealing several areas to be touched up, and the west rubber gutter needs to be weighted down to assist with the flow of water. Materi-

als are on-hand.

- repairs to boiler piping scheduled 8/31 several 3" copper lines are leaking. Betlem H&C.
- carpet shampooing for lounge and possibly sanctuary. Stanley Steemer.
- get assessment of unused ceiling mounted kitchen heating unit and possible removal to facilitate installation of an exhaust hood.
- Village Code Enforcement is looking at the kitchen reno. proposal with respect to exhaust hood requirements, if any. The committee is leaning towards the proper hood vs. no hood at all.
- interior stairwell painting. THANKS, E.T.

FUTURE WORK:

- continue cleaning out the "dungeon" and east storage room off of the dais.
- replace hanging lights in sanctuary with LEDs.
- get estimates internal/external for a thorough cleaning of the church. Vacuuming, dusting, wiping/washing down.
- arrange for snowblowing services for winter. Jamie has expressed a desire to pass it on to someone else.
- install gutters over east entrance doorway.


