Minute for Missions have started! Our first special offering of 2022 will be the One Great Hour of Sharing. One Great Hour of Sharing connects us with people coming together to respond to the needs in their neighborhoods. It is the largest way Presbyterians connect with one another and unite with congregations in every corner of the Church and with partners all over the world. We connect in order to grow together, while offering support that addresses shared needs in a particular context. One Great Hour of Sharing connects us to proclaim that Christ is here! God is with us! Jesus is among those who have least, those who hunger and thirst, those who are sick or alone; with those seeking justice and righteousness with their neighbors and all who are in need. Christ is here, and not here, alone. When we all do a little it adds up to a lot. Park Presbyterian Church will be taking a special collection for the One Great Hour of Sharing on Palm Sunday (April 10). Envelopes are available at church; contact J if you need one.

PPC Session meets every third Wednesday of the month at 7:00pm. The session meetings are open to the congregation. Session can grant voice to those attending. If there is something that you need to address with session, we do ask that you let us know a week or so before so we can put it on the agenda. Please contact Cari Taylor, Clerk of Session, or Susan Frost, Interim of this need. If, for some reason, there is something that must be discussed confidentially, the session may go into executive session, but this would only be for those matters that are confidential at this time.

Together in Christ is a group of mostly lay leaders from area churches here in Newark, NY. They meet the third Tuesday of every month at 5:30pm. Several important missions have been supported by this group, including Common Threads, Family Promise, and Laurel House. These are all important community missions, and it is good to see that so many who claim Jesus Christ as their Lord have banned together to promote ministries that help provide for the needs of those here in the Newark Community. Something new is coming! Lisa Barrett presented that there will soon be a Food Shed on the old Catholic School grounds on Main Street. She will keep it stocked per Food Link guidelines. A Boy Scout earning an eagle's badge will be building the small shed. She told the group that this was sorely needed. The Food Closet is only open two hours every day; the shed is open 24/7. When people are hungry, they can go to the shed and find something for a meal or to eat so they don't go hungry. When up and running, Lisa will let us know. People can help donate specified items for this newest mission. (I'm not sure she called it a "shed"...I'll revise in a later submission.)

Crosses will be made from palms just before discussion time on April 3, 2022, in preparation for Palm/Passion Sunday on April 10th. On Palm Sunday, we will begin the service by waving branches and shouting "Hosanna," (Hebrew for save us) and wanting to crown Jesus as king. But as the story of Christ's passion unfolds, the shouts of praise will turn into demands for his death. Jesus will be handed over to be mocked, tortured, and killed; the crown he receives will be one of thorns. This is the paradox of Palm/Passion Sunday. The service will be one of scripture reading and silent reflection with a brief sermon.

Something new is in the works for Maundy Thursday. Park Presbyterian will have soup and service! Come enjoy some of Natalie's homemade soup, some bread, and a desert at 6:15pm in the lounge. Then, at 7:00pm join the Maundy Thursday Service with Communion in the Sanctuary. It will be livestreamed, but you won't get soup unless you show up! Maundy Thursday from the Latin mandatum (commandment) proclaims Jesus' new commandment to love one another as he has loved us. It celebrates Christ's example of humble service and self-offering. There is an emphasis on confession and forgiveness, concluding the penitential season of Lent. It ends with the stripping of the church.

Come join us on Easter Sunday (April 17th) as we "reclaim" our Alleluia's and join again in Communion as the body of Christ. As with Christmas, Easter refers not only to a single day, but to a whole season of celebration in the Christian year. The season of Easter spans the fifty days between the Resurrection of the Lord and the Day of Pentecost and encompasses the Ascension of the Lord. In this most joyful season, we celebrate the great mystery of our faith—that Jesus Christ is risen from the dead.

Finally, Stu Bear wants to say, "Thank You!" for all the food you have contributed to the Little Red Wagon. We have given sixteen bags of food so far this year. That is as much as was contributed all last year! Keep up the good work. Thank you to Christine and Henry Stephens who are picking up the food and delivering it to the Newark Food Closet once a month.

As you can see, things are a happening at Park Presbyterian Church. Thanks be to the Lord who has plans for our welfare and not for harm, to give us, Park Presbyterian Church a future with hope.

May 8th, Mother's Day, will be a special service organized by the PW.



Remembering those who entered the Church Triumphant

The Rev. John Watkins, former Newark Wayne Community Hospital chaplain, died December 15, 2021, in Harrisonburg, Virginia. Preceding him in death was his wife, Martha, on June 7, 2021. Both were living in the Sunnyside Retirement Community in Harrisonburg. In 1989, John accepted the invitation from the hospital and the Presbytery of Geneva to serve half-time as the first-ever chaplain at the hospital, while also serving half-time as pastor of the Fairville Presbyterian Church. John, a servant leader, will be remembered for his ministry as a non-anxious presence with patients, their families, the hospital staff, and the Newark community. Rotarians enjoyed his dry sense of humor around the lunch table. John retired as chaplain in 2000, and Rev. Carlos Smith was hired to fill the position. Following his retirement from the Fairville church and the hospital chaplaincy, John served as Parish Associate at Newark's Park Presbyterian Church where Rev. Timothy Johnson was pastor. Martha was an active volunteer with the Auxiliary, played the organ and piano for various functions, and worked in the hospital gift shop. In 2007, the Watkins moved to Sunnyside, where they made many friends, and enjoyed several years of volunteering their services to that community.

Dorothy Ann Ehrhardt, 86, passed away peacefully on Sunday (March 13, 2022) at Newark Manor Nursing Home. Dorothy was born the daughter of the late Isaac and Jennie (Leenhouts) Willemsen on Thursday, April 25, 1935, in Sodus, N.Y. Dorothy was raised in the Newark area, graduating from Newark High School. **Dorothy was a member at the Park Presbyterian Church** and a past member at the Newark Fire Department Ladies Auxiliary. She enjoyed golfing and tending to her flower and vegetable gardens. She was an avid traveler visiting Holland and several destinations in the United States. Dorothy was a retiree of C. H. Stuart in Newark. Dorothy's burial in Marion Cemetery in Marion, N.Y., will be in the spring.
