Joshua 1:9 "Have I not commanded you? Be strong and of good courage; do not be frightened or dismayed; for the LORD your God is with you wherever you go."

This is the promise that we have; God is with us wherever we go. This held true for Joshua as he took over command from Moses and as he prepared God's chosen to head into the Promised Land with all its possibilities as well as its uncertainties. This is still true for Park Presbyterian Church as it begins another year and as it nears its Bicentennial in 2025. Like Joshua and the people of God so long ago, we too are called to remain strong and courageous. Park Church continues because there is still work to be done! I look forward to working with Stephanie Lange who was voted in for a three-year term as a deacon, and working with Debbie McCrossen who was just voted in to fill a two-year term and Bob Hanson and Cari Taylor who were voted in for a three-year term as ruling elders. I look forward to continuing work with Holly and Gil Burgess, secretary and treasurer for Deacons, serving three-year terms, and Karen Cameron and Anne Rogers who will both serve three-year terms as ruling elders. Park Presbyterian Church is very fortunate to have such dedication and leadership. Thank you all.

The three task forces have been hard at work the past couple of months. The Mission Task Force has completed a Mission Chart for 2023 which includes some new ideas. One of these is called The Children's Book Garden. During the months of May, June, July, and August, Park Church will be present at the Village

Market on the first and third Thursdays of the month to hand out children's books as part of a children's book ministry. The church congregation will be asked to buy some coloring books to be handed out and the church will supply small packs of crayons. The idea is two-fold—to make Park Church more visible in the community and to provide a witness to children through the giving of books and Children's Bibles. The Holy Spirit has been at work prepping hearts. Soon, we may have a Sunday School for K-2. Stay tuned for more information to come. The Christian Ed Task Force has been addressing the need for continued faith formation from child-hood through adulthood. 
In the sermon for January 22nd, I mentioned all the community groups that use the space that Park Presbyterian Church has been blessed with. Park provides space for two NA groups, for an AA group, for DAR, the Garden Club, Wayne Mineral and Gem Club, for Troop, Pack, and Crew 138, as a meeting place for Together in Christ (TIC) and a rehearsal space for the Finger Lakes Bronze Bells. Another group who has used the space in the past hopes to start again—the Baby Café. Park Presbyterian Church is blessed with space and brainstorming creative ways to use this space is both a blessing and an opportunity.

One of the tasks of the session of any Presbyterian Church (as well as other churches) is the annual review of the membership role. This has caused issues in Park's past; it was never meant to be an issue. Any organization reviews its rolls; a church is no different. With this said, I am not sure that the right message was always sent. The review of the rolls was never meant to push people away. It should ALWAYS be that of encouraging those that may have been absent for a time that their presence is missed; this is because each member is part of the family of God. This isn't about money. It's about people. It's about letting others know they are missed. It's about realizing that every member has a God given gift that is needed to help sustain that church in that time. One of the seven marks of a vital church is Lifelong Disciple Formation. Those members who stay active in any organization do so because that organization brings meaning to their life. We would hope that being a member of Park Presbyterian Church brings a genuine sense of joy, energy, commitment, and passion to a person because you are part of the community of God. Our renewed commitment as a church is this faith formation—a process or journey that is life-long. I pointed out in the January 22nd sermon that "casting nets" requires more than one person. The Christian faith was never meant to be lived in solitude. Even Jesus called others to follow; what we do, we do in community. We are stronger together. As Park reaches out to you, we hope that you will let us know how we can encourage you in your faith journey young, middle-aged, or senior alike, because our Christian journey is life-long.

Park Presbyterian Church continues to believe that God is with us just like God was with Joshua and those Israelites so long ago. We too follow God's command to be courageous and to look at the future for what it holds—knowing that no matter what, God promises to be with us.

PW Horizon's Bible Study to start Weds. April 19, 2023, from 12:00-1:00 PM.

Christine Stephens will start a Women's Bible Study using *Cloud of Witnesses: The Community of Christ in Hebrews- a* 2017–2018 *Horizons* Bible study by Melissa Bane Sevier. In nine lessons, author Melissa Bane Sevier invites us to explore major themes found in Hebrews, relate these themes to other parts of our faith tradition, and tie them together with the overarching motif of community. The community for which the letter, or homily, was written interacts, in a sense, with all communities of which we are a part, as we bring these groups with us wherever we go. This ever-present "great cloud of witnesses" (Heb. 12:1) strengthens and encourages us as we "run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus the pioneer and perfecter of our faith" (Heb. 12:1b–2). It will begin on Wednesday, April 19th from 12-1PM. She will poll the women as to whether they want to do the first and third Weds or every Weds...etc. at the first meeting. The books have been ordered along with an accompanying DVD. Books are \$10 each.

Lenten Series to begin on Weds., March 1, 2023; it will run for 6 consecutive Weds to include-March 8, 15, 22, 29, and April 5. We will use the book, *Luke-Jesus and the Outsiders, Outcasts, and Outlaws*, by Adam Hamilton. Books are available in the office. There will be two sessions- an early afternoon, and a late afternoon. There is a sign-up sheet in the lounge. 



As part of the Newark Community, PPC helps host a Monday fellowship dinner four times during the year. Warm, homemade, nutritious, and well-balanced meals are provided. During the year families are transported to appointments and to get groceries when needed. This year, with the support of Session, PPC donated the supplies gathered for our rotation weeks when they stayed in our church to the families. PPC also donated some of the furniture from the third floor that is not being used so upon graduation from the program they will move into their new homes with pieces of furniture. Members of the PPC congregation have supplied help during emergencies for the families. PPC has worked with the Newark Family Promise Support group with joy to help our neighbors. God will keep guiding us and prompting us to do God's work. Praise to God for help and strength in everything we do.
