#### January 15, 2023-Tasks of the Church

At a recent retreat on 2-11-2023, the session created the following proposed purpose statement for Park Church:

**"To work together to support individual needs for spiritual growth, fellowship, and acceptance."** (It needs to be voted on by the congregation) This would seem to agree with the discussion on the **tasks of the church**.

Of very high importance was:

- Providing for worship
- Providing a caring ministry to sick and shut-in persons

Of high importance were:

- Providing fellowship opportunities for church members and congregants (fellowship)
- Encouraging caring relationships between church members and congregants (acceptance)
- Providing educational opportunities that nurture an individual's spiritual growth from childhood to adulthood. (Spiritual growth)
- Providing pastoral care and counseling for church members and congregants

Of importance were:

- Encouraging engagement with social justice issues—depending on the issue
- Nurturing a stronger personal relationship with God. (Individual's spiritual growth)
- Encouraging a healthy understanding of stewardship as all encompassing
- Providing "helping" opportunities where members and congregants encounter

Sharing the gospel with the un-churched

Supporting world mission

Providing for different prayer and meditation practices to aide an individual's spiritual growth

### **Notes from Congregational Discussion on Feb. 19, 2023**

**What do you feel should be Park Church's primary focus over the next 5 years?**

**Publicizing**-to bring to the attention of the public-to advertise.

Talked about the need to have a person/group interested in coordinating and managing content creation on blogs, social media, and other media (local newspapers, etc.)

**Networking**-Simply put, networking means **building connections with other professionals**. Networking should always be beneficial to both parties. The reasons why networking is important include a better reputation, increased visibility, a stronger support network, improved growth, and more impactful connections.

Talked about the need to network-to reach out and connect with—those that Park supports in mission and publicize the mission work.

Publicize events that have happened and their impact on the community which will increase visibility, provide a stronger support network, possibly improve growth, and make a more impactful connection between Park Church and the focused community group and its clients.

Invite speakers from the focused community groups to come and speak about impact of mission on their not-for-profit—helps to inform the church community of their impact and also allows for dialogue of needs from the community group.

**Task: \*creation of a content marketing team**

**\*\* Whether publicizing or networking-must be linked back to the proposed purpose statement:**

**“To work together to support individual needs for spiritual growth, fellowship, and acceptance.”**

**Sustainability**-meeting our own needs without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their own needs; ability to maintain or support a process continuously over time.

**Task: \*creation of a sustainability task force to consider the issues and to present options**

**Describe the gifts, skills, and experiences this congregation possesses to fulfill its mission.**

Talked about the difference between a rowboat church and a sailboat church.

Rowboat churches tend to look at the facilities they have, count noses in the church and decide what programs the volunteer forces can handle without too much stress, and only consider possibilities that are manageable given the resources at hand. In this way, the functioning of the church is kept within its comfort zone. Potential for failure and the need of risk or sacrifice are minimized. The result, however, is the vision for the future is primarily shaped by what the church now lacks.

Sailboat churches understand that when the church is busy doing what God wants it to do, the resources will be provided. Leaders move away from money-in-the-bank mentality and start focusing instead on seeking and doing God's will in everything.

Discussion centered around the way you consider gifts, skills, and experiences—is it something one already possesses or something that is “grown” from experience? Considered:

#### Training

Either work in partnership with another so there are two

Having a present “chair” work with a “vice-chair”—so there is always someone in training that will have the ability to at least know some of the ins-and-outs if something happens to the chair or the chair changes (I use chair loosely—in that whoever is taking leadership is always “training” another)

Discussion also centered around the idea of more inclusion—instead of a small group of selectees—to try to promote “acceptance” (see proposed purpose statement) so that “others” in the congregation are made to feel like they matter and that they are worthy of participating and helping out and that their gifts are “grown” also.

#### **Describe the gifts, skills, and experience a future pastor needs to possess to fulfill Park's vision for mission-both within and without the church walls.**

The following traits were listed and discussed:

Energy

Tech Savvy

Deep Faith

Loving

Experience—in delegating responsibilities

Experience--someone who has dealt with helping an aging congregation reflect where they are now and can help guide the church forward

Servant leader-someone who both listens and helps; someone who walks with the congregation

Someone with the same “why” as Park Church-a match (see the purpose statement)

Matchup with Park on Mission Focus

Someone who is able to reach individuals by being both welcoming and helping them to feel that they have worth.

Expository preaching-exposes or expounds on the meaning of the preaching text in its contexts letting the text of Scripture create the point(s) of the sermon.

Encouraging the formation of small groups

#### **One Great Hour of Sharing: “A little *change (money)* can make a big *change (difference)*!”**

The Season of Lent is designed as a journey. Part of this journey involves joining with other Presbyterians to share God's love with our neighbors-in-need around the world through the One Great Hour of Sharing special collection to take place on Palm Sunday. (April 2, 2023). 32% of this offering goes to Presbyterian Disaster Assistance; 36% goes to the Presbyterian Hunger Program; and 32% of this goes to self-development of people—investing in communities responding to their experiences of racism, oppression, poverty, and injustice and educates Presbyterians about the impact of these societal ills. Fish boxes will be handed out on February 26, 2023, during Stu's Corner. This is a fun way of collecting coins throughout the 40 days of Lent. Please join us in the fun, get your Fish Bank, color it and start collecting! You don't have to be a kid to enjoy this activity. Even a little “change” can make a big change!



## *A Season of Lent*

*(from the Book of Common Worship)*

“Lent” comes from an old English word for springtime, perhaps connected with the lengthening of days in this time of the year in the Northern Hemisphere. The season of Lent is time for growth in faith—through prayer, spiritual discipline, and self-examination in preparation for the commemoration of the dying and rising of the Lord Jesus Christ. In ancient Christian practice, Lent was a time of preparation for the celebration of Baptism at Easter. In many churches, it remains a time to equip and nurture candidates for Baptism or confirmation, and for the whole community of faith to reflect deeply on the theme of baptismal discipleship. Reconciliation is a key theme in the season of Lent—reconciliation with God and with one another through the grace of Jesus Christ. Lent is a period of forty days—like the flood of Genesis, Moses’ sojourn at Sinai, Elijah’s journey to Mount Horeb, Jonah’s call of repentance to Nineveh, and Jesus’ time of testing in the wilderness. The Sundays in Lent are not counted among the forty days, as every Lord’s Day is a celebration of Christ’s resurrection. Lent begins with Ash Wednesday and concludes at sunset on Holy Saturday, at the start of the Great Vigil of Easter.

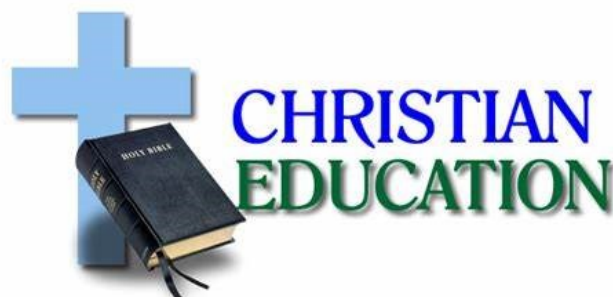

#### **PW Horizon's Bible Study to start Weds. April 19, 2023, from 12:00-1:00 PM.**

Christine Stephens will start a Women's Bible Study using *Cloud of Witnesses: The Community of Christ in Hebrews- a 2017-2018 Horizons Bible study* by Melissa Bane Sevier. In nine lessons, author Melissa Bane Sevier invites us to explore major themes found in Hebrews, relate these themes to other parts of our faith tradition, and tie them together with the overarching motif of community. Mission Task Force Report March 2023

The newly formed Mission Task force has met twice now, and we are excited to report that we now have a schedule of mission activities planned for the entire year!!!

You are already familiar with the Warming Tree and the Red Wagon. We collect for the Food Closet each month, and we are currently collecting a second round of scarves, mittens and hats for Newark's two elementary schools. That donation will be made the week of March 5<sup>th</sup>, so there's still time to donate. This year's Super Bowl collection of children's new socks and underwear was donated to Common Threads. Check out the picture of all the socks hanging on a clothesline in the lobby! The Park Church Women's Rummage sale will begin accepting donations on March 20<sup>th</sup>. Please remember that any furniture must be able to be picked up by one person. The actual sale will be held from April 20th to the 22<sup>nd</sup>.

This summer we are planning a Children's Book Garden to be held every other week at the Newark Farmer's Market. We will be giving away children's book, including coloring books and crayons. The collection for the coloring books, crayons and reading books will begin in May, and extend through August. We'll also be looking for volunteers to distribute the free books at the Farmer's Market. Sign up for one-hour shifts will begin in early June.

Calling all quilters, sewers, and people with two hands! In September and October, we will be supporting Survivor Advocacy with "Hope in a Tote". This will be like the purse collection we did last fall. Donations for both the tote bags and the personal hygiene & make-up items will begin in September. To cut down on costs, we are planning to make the tote bags. Anyone who can sew, and/or measure and cut fabric will be able to contribute. In the meantime, keep your eye out for material for the bags.

Rounding out the year will be the Advent Bags assembled by PW and distributed by the Deacons. We'll also have the Holiday Dinner Bags for the Food Closet as we did this past year.

On a larger scale, Park Women will be working with Family Promise to aid in their purchase of a rental property for their participating families. This project will also include other churches and non-profits from the area that Family Promise services.

The committee also discussed supporting Food Closet's purchase of a new vehicle to pick up food donations from Food Link. We are seeking more information from Food Closet's Executive Director, Lisa Barrett, and hope to bring a proposal before the session soon.

### **Family Promise:**

The Park Presbyterian Women have made a commitment to support Family Promise. The Session has also committed mission funds toward this goal. See Sue Rowe if interested in committing some of your time and/or talents to potentially promote raising funds for Family Promise to "purchase" a home rather than continue renting which is not feasible overall. Get involved in this new "vision." They have a 95% graduation rate—those who graduate from their program can maintain living on their own and supporting their families. This just proves that Family Promise works!

## *Good News from the Congregation*

For 10 years Doug Doeblner led mission trips to Haiti. He was on the Board of Directors for caring house foundation and donated his time and paid expenses for these trips. The purpose of the trips were to dedicate a village that the foundation had built into raise funds to build another village. The average number of people on these trips was 45. Trips have been canceled the past three years because of unrest in Haiti. A young man by the name of Marc was in his interpreter and last summer, he sent Doug an email telling Doug he was recently married and asked if Doug could help them come to America. Recently the president ministration created a humanitarian immigrant program which included Haiti. Sponsoring a couple and they arrive on Tuesday, February 21. They will live in Canandaigua. Linda Werts works as part of a group in Canandaigua who help immigrants settle in Canandaigua. Her group has already settled two Ukrainian families and are helping Doug with the people from Haiti with paperwork and housing. It will be interesting to follow the ongoing story.

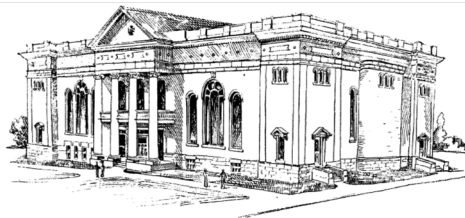
