ABOUT TODAY'S READINGS

Welcome to our parish. Today, Jesus uses a parable to teach about prayer. In it, an unjust judge grants his petitioner's plea only because she will not leave him alone until he does. Jesus says that God will also grant the prayers of those who cry to God day and night. The point is not that God, like the judge, will only be responsive to those who nag. It is, as Luke says, to teach us the need to pray always and not lose heart.

The first reading describes Jacob's tenacity in wrestling with the stranger in the dark. Jacob was not able to win the match because the stranger was God. Yet, Jacob's persistence brings him his new identity as the forebear of God's people. He is given a new name, Israel, which means "he who strives with God."

In today's reading from the second letter to Timothy, this early church leader is called to persevere in teaching and preaching the faith he has been given both by his family and in his study of the scriptures. This letter was written in a time when an aberrant form of Christianity was being proclaimed. Timothy is to stick with what he has learned from the scriptures and from Paul.

Our baptism has called us into a life characterized by the need never to give up our search for God. Faithfulness involves a giving of all that we are and all that we have. God asks us never to lose heart and to give all of our time, treasure, and talents to the ministry of God in this world. 

OUTREACH AT ST. JOHN'S

Outreach's Fall quarter focus is to support vulnerable Immigrant families in our community.

St John's is helping to support a Guatemalan family who have taken sanctuary refuge in Olympia's Temple Beth Hatfiloh. Maria and her young son are fleeing deportation back to Guatemala and the domestic violence she suffered there. Outreach also continues to support CIELO, the Olympia-based nonprofit which provides education, mental health, and victim of crimes services for mainly Spanishspeaking immigrant families.

On November 1st, CIELO is hosting a free DIA de Los Muertos celebration for families—all are welcome! A "Noche de Gala" evening fundraiser will take place on November 9th, 5 pm to 10:30 pm, celebrating the diversity of Latino cultures that CIELO's families represent.
