

## What Should I Bring to Camp?

Listed below are items that you may want to consider packing (and not packing) for camp. Realize that being in God's beautiful creation means possibly getting dirty, wet, or encounter various kinds of living creatures: this can be a lot of fun when you are prepared!

We want to make the experience as comfortable as possible for you when you come to camp. The list below are the staff's suggestions for you, but what you bring is not limited to what is on this list; you may want to include a few extra things that we may not be aware of for your own personal needs.

### **What to bring:**

- Bible
- Jeans/Outdoor Long Pants
- Shorts or Pajama's
- T-shirts
- Towels
- Underwear
- Jacket/Sweatshirt
- Toiletries
- Athletic Shoes
- Swimwear (one piece or tankini for girls, knee-length trunks for boys)
- Flashlight
- Sleeping Bag or bedding for twin bed
- Pillow
- Sunglasses
- Sunscreen & Bug spray
- Socks
- Hat
- Canteen/gift shop money (see below)
- **Old Shoes and Clothes that can get dirty**

### **What not to bring:**

- Food or drinks
- Fireworks
- CD's
- Electronic devices
- Cell phones (any cell phones brought to camp will be collected by staff and kept in the office until the last day of camp)
- Extra jewelry
- Weapons (including pocket knives)
- Squirt guns
- Pets

**Canteen/Gift Shop (\*OPTIONAL\*):** Throughout the week campers will receive the opportunity to buy a snack and drink during canteen time. This money (recommended \$10 for the week) can be included in the registration cost or submitted at registration. Campers should not carry this money on them during the week. Campers will also not be able to use this money on gift shop items until the end of the week after they have been signed out.

**Medications:** At the beginning of the week, **ALL** medication will be turned into Heit's Point senior staff. We will be sure to give out medication as prescribed and according to the camper's health form. **We do not allow any medications (including vitamins) in the cabin.** However, if there are particular medications that need to be with the participant on a regular basis (i.e. an inhaler), other arrangements will certainly be made.
