### **Greetings from Heit's Point!**

We want to thank God for letting us serve Him here at Heit's Point. We want to thank Him for all the things accomplished through our donors and volunteers. The activity center is complete and being used regularly; the stone house has a new metal roof; there are three new campsites; six new tent sites and two new tree houses that have been very popular with the kids. Numerous other maintenance tasks were completed as well; the condition of our facilities has never been better.

We want to thank God for the successes He let us be a part of: "Over 150 youth at summer camp, four youth were baptized, two inner city families and eight inner city youth attended camp, and 130 youth participated in fall confirmation retreats."

His blessings went beyond our programs. Fifteen scrap-book events brought in a total income over \$35,000. Twelve reunions through the summer and into the fall brought income over \$30,000. Other special events, 4-H camp, American Field Service, and Abused youth camp, brought in over \$18,000. Our general local use increased again this year and our relationship with our local communities is improving as well.

Our contract income increased by 2% this year over last year. Donations have increased more than 24% over last year. Thrivent choice has been very successful for us, we received almost double what was projected. Our Dollar-a-Day program has generated some new support and we are looking forward to future growth. Our expenses decreased by 6%. This was accomplished even though food costs went up and the Environmental Protection Agency changing testing requirements for our waste management system.

The staff and I want to thank all of you for your support. This Ministry has grown amazingly fast. Heit's Point is only thirty years old and yet compared to other Lutheran camps across the country, we have a much more diversified ministry. God has a plan for this place and He continues to challenge us with new things.

### **What's coming in 2012!**

Some of our programs the past few years have suffered for attendance. Our new Program Director Leah has brought a new vitality to the programs and 2012 proves to be an exciting year. Check out our website to see the details.

Our diverse Ministry expands on its own. Word of mouth has been our best advertising. We had an event in 2011 that was attended by a gentleman that is involved with the Baptist association out of Sedalia. In 2012 the Harmony Baptist Association has scheduled a week long camp for 150 youth. The opportunities of sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ continue to expand.

Our 2012 budget has been approved and again has a projected 6% decrease in expenses. We have planned very conservatively to ensure the economy does not affect our sustainability.

We thank God for continuing to challenge us in our service to Him.

## "From The Chairman"

I want you to know that this board has been working very hard the last two months. We had a special board meeting the 17<sup>th</sup> of October. On the 17<sup>th</sup> of November we met for a Site Plan/Optimal Utilization work session. After our regular board meeting on November 18<sup>th</sup> we invited our staff family for dinner at Charlie's as a special "Thank You" for their support of the Ministry. Then on the 19<sup>th</sup> of November the board members attended the Friends of Heit's Point voters meeting.

We want to thank the slate of new board members for saying yes when asked to serve on our board. I believe they are bringing a broad base of relevant experience that will be a valuable asset for our future. We also want to thank Glen McLaughlin, Ferol Thaemert and Caryl Froeschle who are going off the board for their dedicated service to Heit's Point.

During all of these meetings, we spent considerable time discussing with Mark our financial position at the end of the year, our budget for next year, and what we needed to do to contain our cost while increasing our usage which will increase our revenue stream. The staff has nearly completed three grant applications: LWML Grant for Youth Ministry Facility, Ramsey Family Foundation for program support and Thrivent for Urban Ministry. All of these grant requests if approved would greatly improve our ability to provide a facility to support our current programs and subsidize expansion of new programs.

Our special meeting on the November 17<sup>th</sup> was facilitated by Jack Hollingsworth and was very productive. Each board member submitted their answers to four basic questions. They were:

1. If money were not an issue, what would be #1, #2, #3 on your "Dream List" for Heit's Point?
2. What do you personally see as the #1 need for Heit's Point?
3. What do you feel is the greatest challenge for Heit's Point?
4. How can we best grow the Heit's Point Ministry?

The collective answers to each question were discussed for the purpose of providing to the staff the direction for developing the 3 Year Master Plan, as well as being reflected in the 2012 Goals & Objectives. The two documents will be distributed to the board for review and voted upon in our December 4<sup>th</sup> meeting.

We expect to have the Optimum Utilization Plan finalized in December. It will reflect existing infrastructure locations and identify what type of use various areas could offer in support of our ministry.

As you can see, we (staff and board) are really trying to assess what we have, what we do well, what we need to do, and to develop a realistic plan to accomplish goals that will be financially viable and support our mission. Needless to say, we need your support and your prayers. We know that it can be done and with His help, it will.


Ferol and his family were also involved in the construction of the Gospel Hostel and the Blunk bunkhouse.

# TRIBUTE TO SERVICE

Glen McLaughlin

It may take me a few paragraphs to talk about this gentleman. In a way he is responsible for my being at Heit's Point.

I started working at Heit's Point in 1999 as a volunteer in maintenance. Dennis Stewart was the Director at the time and Heit's Point was in the midst of building the Dr. Paul Spitz Center. Glen and his wife Shirley were very much involved with the planning and construction. I retired from the Air Force in 2001 and went to work as the delivery driver at the local lumber yard. But, working with Glen and seeing his dedication to the ministry at Heit's Point, I wanted to work at Heit's Point. When Dennis Stewart left, **Glen served as Interim Director** and when the new Director Jeff Pool arrived the opportunity arose for me to come back as the maintenance man. I worked as maintenance for about a year, when the lumber yard offered me a job as manager, with salary and benefits that I couldn't refuse. I was only gone from Heit's Point for about a year and a half. I think every time Glen came down from Kansas City he stopped by the lumberyard and asked me when I was coming back. Finally when Roger Mailand took over as the Director, I told Glen that if Roger wanted me there, I would come back. Roger's situation at the Missouri District changed and after one year he went back to the District full time.

What do you think happened next? Yes, **Glen served as Interim Director again**. This was a trying time for Heit's Point the District was having financial issues and Heit's Point needed to stand on its own. In addition Heit's Point needed to pay off over \$600,000 in debt to the District. Larry Lumpe did the fundraising and Glen held Heit's Point together. This is also the time he developed the Friends of Heits Point organization. For a little over a year, Glen served as the Interim Director. He and Shirley spent many, many, many days at Heit's Point making sure operations continued. Over that year and the next the Friends of Heit's Point organization raised funds that proved essential to the operations over the next two years.

When the Outdoor Festival happens, who do you think is always there? We all know Shirley is in charge, but we let Glen think that he is. In fact, the past two years the Festival has been a great success because of their leadership.

I could name, couple after couple that are involved with this ministry because of Glen one of them is a board member. Glen is always sharing the ministry. This past year the Friends of Heit's Point became a more integral part of the operations. The organization now is involved in the election of board members, another change with Glen's leadership.

Yes, Glen has been the backbone of Heit's Point for many years. However, I must share some of the lighter side of Glen.

- How about when his grandkids are here, I think Glen loses 50 years when their around.
