The building committee has been hard at work analyzing the final bids submitted for the Rinne Activity Center. A contract was executed September 14th with the concrete work starting on October 4th.

Mark Nolte presented our financial reports which covered through August 2010 as well as his proposed budget for 2011. Caryl Froeschle, our Treasurer, and Mark spent considerable time analyzing our performance over the last three year period and tried to determine what needed to be done for next year. As you recall, we trimmed the budget this year by 25% to compensate for the downturn in the economy. The economy has not helped us this year and does not look any better for next year. However, we are not going to let this discourage us from our mission of providing significant programs to all ages. The board discussed new avenues to raise additional funds and they are making plans to do so.

We are still working hard on building relationships. We had our first social event for Heit's Point supporters in the Kansas City area last month and will be having one in the Jefferson City area this month. Again the purpose is to discuss what we have been doing, where we are going and how you can build a bridge in getting more families interested in the significance of our ministry.

OPERATIONAL STATUS AND FINANCIALS

If you call in you're likely to hear a new voice. Cindy is our new Front Office Administrator; she is only part time so Melisa or I will fill in. Please welcome Cindy into our family; we are blessed to have her as part of our team. We are using volunteers much more extensively this year, and as they become more familiar with operations, the blessings or their labors will continue to increase.

July/August

Income – \$41,661 less income than budgeted

Expenses - \$2,691 less expenses than budgeted

Contract income is down 17% and donations down over 50% from 2009.

As you can see the economy has affected our income, however, by watching our expenses we have a net loss of only \$25,337 for the first 8 months, even with this shortfall with diligence through the fall we will have a successful year. The staff and board at Heit's Point are making every effort to wisely steward the resources which we have been blessed.
