It's the season of Resurrection Day and its aftermath. Upon the resurrection of Jesus, if but for a moment the universe seemed knocked back into a better sense of reality. Powers and principalities joined slaves and rulers, tax collectors and fishermen, rabbis and Romans with their own versions of how an unexpected (or even long-expected) brush with the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob had left them – well, *different*.

By and large, Jesus had left each one breathless. Who else had been so relentless in seeking and saving those who found themselves on the fringes of "proper" society (whatever that meant)? Who else was restoring those who were normally ignored? Who else said he was doing the work of the Father, and this Father loved them beyond reason or rationale, so they should expect Him to provide what they needed to take the next step into a greater, deeper journey that would define life itself?

Is this what God's work looks like? Is he calling us into adventure rather than sitting in the corner for breaking the classroom code? How does that happen?

What is the exact representation of the invisible God?

In Colossians 1:15, Paul reminds us that Jesus Christ is "the image of the invisible God." Again, "For in him the whole fullness of deity dwells bodily" (Col. 2:9). It is "in the face of Jesus Christ" that we can know God (2 Cor. 4:6).

In other words, when they looked (or when we look) at Jesus they were (or we are) looking at God. We're looking at the invitation to know the heart and mind of Christ. No longer is it a

matter being kept out of the things of God because we can't keep current with the decorum. Now it is a matter of knowing God in a connected relationship with Jesus Christ, and nothing less.

Let's learn how that friendship can unpack in love for God and our neighbors like never before.
