HERE'S TO SOFT ANSWERS AND LONG MARRIAGES

You might be familiar with this invaluable wisdom from Proverbs 15:1:

A soft answer turns away wrath, but a harsh word stirs up anger.

That simple piece of advice has helped resolve the heat of an argument for me in business settings, church committees, editorial crises, but especially – don't miss this – at home. With my immensely talented, lovely bride. And my strapping, brilliant son. And my poetic, always creative daughter.

You see, we all like to talk. So do the kids' spouses. For cryin' out loud, so do our grandchildren. Inevitably, in the course of human communication, one feels misunderstood or misheard or ignored. Then we escalate the volume as well as the tension in the room. At about three such escalations, the room becomes very uncomfortable, indeed.

Here is a secret to our marriage surviving to its 43rd year: Soft answers. Always, if at all appropriate. Especially if you're considering a retort that will eviscerate your counterpart(s) in the discussion. My last discussion when I forgot to apply that wisdom was about a decade ago. Our son Ben and I were debating (over dessert) some fine theological point that mattered to both of us. (Today I have no idea what it was that put us at such odds.) Maggie called us out to manage our discussion with more grace, and to keep the volume civil. Of course, she was right.

Soft answers. I'm still working on it. This comes home to roost this month as I prayerfully send Annie to Liberia to assist a long-term friend's ministry in gathering stories and images of the vocational training centers they run in Christian schools there. We'll miss our anniversary

Soft answers. It's one habit that I can encourage anyone to try at home. So if you haven't already, memorize Proverbs 15:1. Then apply it generously.

On-going prayers of well-being for shut-ins and military personnel.

For regular prayer requests, please text or call and leave a message for Dot North at 402-658-6401, emails may not be seen in a timely manner. She will confirm that your request was received and it will be sent out to the prayer chain. Your prayers are very important.

1. In July, all 47 remaining tree stumps were removed for \$45 each.

- 2. Proposals have been presented for parking lot and drive work to seal cracks, seal coat the asphalt surface and repaint the parking stall stripes and handicap stalls. With our limited budget, we will likely only be able to have the cracks sealed.
- 3. Proposals are being finalized to address the serious erosion problem in our northeast lawn for the Ministry Council to decide on. This will likely be an approximate \$6K decision.
- 4. Upgrading the upstairs women's and men's restroom toilets is still being looked into.
- 5. Sunset Hills helped a 14-person mission team from Illinois stay overnight on July 22. Thanks to our Safety and Security Team and other volunteers who made their stay a memorable one. As well, for all who prayed with and for them as they left to serve God in South Dakota.

A new leader for this ministry to partner with Ron Reed is being prayed for. Thanks to each of you who serve on the 2023 Stewardship Ministry Team to help care for God's Sunset Hills building and grounds. All of the tasks could not be done without your serving our Father in this way.






