You could see the talent in The Kid a mile away. If things went as planned, he'd be ready to lead the team in just a few years. But in a few years.

Kansas City Chiefs Head Coach Andy Reid asked his veteran QB Alex Smith to show the ropes to the 10th-pick rookie, one Patrick Mahomes. The coach also encouraged Mahomes to pick up everything he could on how to conduct himself on and off the field from Smith.

There were fine points that reps and dedicated trips to the film room could take care of. And they were. The Kid was a quick study and not just in the mechanics of the game. Mahomes watched Smith handle the press, and handle relationships with the rest of the team. He saw the respect Smith showed for the coaching and administrative staff. He even learned the etiquette necessary to communicate well with the team owners.

Alex Smith brought a different kind of coaching to the table: that of mentoring for the long haul. Mahomes utilized Smith's mentoring to quickly come up to speed on how to be a leader in the NFL environment. When Smith was traded to make room for Mahomes, the younger QB was more than ready to handle himself in a sometimes brutal professional environment.

It's the kind of coaching and communication we are encouraged to take on. Those of us who have seasoned experience in matters of faith and practice need to engage in coaching others on the ins and outs of leadership and faithfulness. Those of us who would benefit from a mentor can feel free to ask around and find one (or more!). Whatever one's age, we need to prepare and be prepared to train, encourage and support the next generation of Jesus followers in the ways and Word of God. Like the verses above indicate, God can and will handle our examination, our questions, and our needs to help make it happen.

We're blessed with some real talent at Sunset Hills. Let's help each other make the most of what God has given!



Volunteers Read Across America is planned March 4-8 at Pine Elementary School on 10th Street, between the Old Market and the Henry Doorly Zoo. New Missions and Outreach Ministry member Annie Wamberg is handling communications between the church, readers and school coordinator. Continuing our service at Pine, we will feed staff for parent conferences later in March.

We again will have an Easter Egg hunt for the youngsters after worship on Easter morning. We encourage everyone to provide plastic eggs and candy in the weeks prior to Easter so they can be packaged as needed before Easter morning.

Sunset Hills has a prime opportunity to connect with the immediate neighborhood by serving as a polling place for the May primary and the November general elections. Other than having the facility ready, there is very limited need for church involvement. The voting area is bounded by 84th and 96th Streets, and West Dodge Road to Pacific Street.

We could use someone to update our street sign message before our Easter week services.

There is the possibility for a church outing at an Omaha Storm Chasers baseball game. The Faith and Family Night game and concert is Saturday, July 20. We also could do a different game, maybe a Sunday 5 p.m. start time with no concert, less expensive tickets and earlier drive home. I'm eager to get feedback so we can plan accordingly.

We're studying to see if we could align with a particular missionary, one we could support financially while building a working relationship with Sunset Hills.

Missions and Outreach will continue to look for ways for AB Men and AB Women to meet and serve, as well as providing for the Cabin 9 remodel at Camp Moses Merrill.
