Over the weekend I finally met my new grandson face-to-face. He showed up around a week overdue, as I understand it. When it was clear the baby wasn't about to arrive according to our original plan (silly us!) the question quickly became, "What do we do until the baby comes?"

It ended up that there was plenty to do. Sort of. There was a lot of checking and re-checking, at least. The nursery had been ready for a couple of months. Check. Diapers, bedding and baby clothing: inventoried. Car seats for five: ready. Grandma and PopPop (that would be Annie and I) keeping the baby's siblings for several overnights so our daughter-in-love Brittany and son Ben could rest while waiting: you betcha.

Seven or eight days behind our schedule but probably right on time in God's opinion, Benson Torin Wamberg was napping soundly when it was my turn to hold all 8 pounds, 10 ounces of him yesterday. After ten minutes or so Benson stirred and opened one eye to check me out. It was just for a few seconds, then he slept again. It was a simple and fulfilling moment.

## Missions and Outreach Ministry – Terry Anderson

When Sunset Hills, the church, was new, so was Sunset Hills, the neighborhood—making connections, making friends, making new lives with mostly Baby Boomers.

The church was a connection with the neighborhood, first with the Fellowship Hall, which served as the sanctuary until our current sanctuary was ready for occupancy. Then came the educational wing. The church served the community, with two services on Sunday mornings and a preschool.

The preschool was gone by the time I became a member in 1986. The only time I recall two services was on Easter during COVID. Times have changed. Churches aren't as much of a neighborhood center as they once were. Schools have become more of a focus point, as have, to some extent shopping areas.

Sunset Hills, the church, can become a stronger force, just by becoming more available to those living nearby. We're doing that by serving as a polling place for Nebraska's primary election on May 14. Several years ago, when the Pacific Row project on our east border was still in planning stages, the church hosted a required meeting for developers and residents on both sides of Pacific Street. The meeting drew a crowd, many of whom had never been inside our church and knew nothing of what we offered. They just didn't know.

Serving as a polling place will bring residents – neighbors – from  $84^{th}$  to  $96^{th}$  Streets and from Pacific to West Dodge Road through our front doors. Once they get inside, they may like what they see and come back or tell others about us – connecting.

We can do special things to make Sunset Hills, the church, more inviting, such as cleaning inside and outside during the spring work day, and having posters on the walls to promote Vacation Bible School.

There are five churches along Pacific Street from the 84<sup>th</sup> Street intersection to Interstate 680. Having voters come through our doors is just one way to serve our neighbors. What other ways come to your mind?
