



So this old man reclaimed the back section of his lot that was overgrown with briars and weeds and scrubby little trees. He cleared it off and planted

a garden and it was fine garden. He brought his neighbor over to show it off a bit. The neighbor was impressed as he looked out over the rows of vegetables and sweet corn and melons and said, "Isn't it wonderful what God can grow?" The old man said, "Yeah it is, but you should seen this mess before I got here."

I love that story. Last month in this space I wrote that I believe 2017 is our time to GROW. Ecclesiastes 3 says, "There is a time for everything and a season for every activity under heaven." I have the sense we are entering First Baptist Church's growing season.

But just as in the funny little story above, growth doesn't happen without our involvement. Oh, it would be nice if God sprinkled some sort of growth fertilizer on our congregation and we magically began to grow in number, giving, and most importantly, in spirit. But God in His wisdom doesn't work that way most of the time. Most of the time God wants us to work alongside Him. Yes, God does provide the growth.

God will give Betsy and me a fine little raised-bed garden again this year but only after we till the soil, plant the seeds, turn on the water, etc. You get the picture; God likes for us to roll up our sleeves and get to work if we want a garden to grow.

Same with church growth. In my low country South Carolina vernacular we would say, "It ain't gonna just happen." We've got to work alongside God if we want to see our church grow. So how do we work alongside God if we want our church to grow? Let's start with growth in number. It's simple. All we have to do is do it, and you know what it is; invite people to come to church with you to worship God and hear the gospel. There is no great secret to church growth. Church's whose members love their God and love their church and say to others, "Come to church with me," always, always grow. So this week think of someone you know who doesn't attend church somewhere regularly and invite them to come with you.

And remember why we want to grow. It's not just so we can have a bigger church. That's not it at all. We want to grow because the person you think of that is not attending a church regularly is missing so

much of what God wants that person to have: the joy of a healthy relationship with God, a sense of the forgiveness of sins, the reassurance of eternal life in Christ, the joy of worshipping, serving, giving. All this can be found in the Body of Christ, the church. God, I believe, is calling us to GROW because people so desperately need God in their lives.



THE HISTORIAN'S COLUMN

Let me introduce myself. My first experience with FBC Hickory was in 1963 as a member of the Scout Troup that met there. I played football on a grassy area near the education building. There was a Colonial grocery store across the street. I returned in the early eighties because my wife to be Susan and I used church attendance as part of our dating experience. Susan had been a member since 1965. I joined the church formally in 1984 and was baptized by Dr. Mobley. I admit I was a little old to be taking the dip. Susan and I were married in the Gray House in 1985. All three of my children were baptized by Dr. Bill Leathers in the Church Baptistery.

I am an ordained Deacon in our church having served several active terms. I was an RA leader for over seven years. I taught high school Sunday School for several years.
